
This year-long subject equips students with the skills to seek employment.



Students select five (5) elective subjects.

The following conditions apply:

- Science maximum of four electives
- ► Languages studied for two semesters and counts as two (2) electives
- Arts or Technology maximum of three elective subjects
- ▶ VET counts as two (2) elective units
- ► HPE and High Performance Sport limits apply, as per next slide





HPE and High Performance Sport



Students may select a maximum of two (2) electives from the following:

- High Performance (semester 1)
- ► High Performance (semester 2)
- Physical Education
- Exercise Prescription and Design

Students may **also** choose Health and Human development (either to supplement the above, or by itself).

In total, students may select a maximum of three (3) units from this Learning Area.

The Dean of High Performance Sport will approve enrolment into High Performance Sport subjects.

If you are not approved to study High Performance Sport, you will be allocated one of your reserve subjects.

Do not select three electives of PE and High Performance as one will revert to your reserve choice.

Manchester City Program



- ► Suited for students who are interested in pursuing a pathway in the Sport Academy (Preston Campus) beyond Year 10.
- Only one class is on offer for 2026, a specific selection criteria will be applied.
- ► The program will replace two units of the maximum three permitted from the High Performance Sport / HPE electives.
- ► Students representing the College in ACC do not need to be a part of this program. ACC selection is a separate process.
- Timetable conflicts may arise if students elect both the Manchester City program and a VCE acceleration subject.

All enquiries regarding selection are to be directed to the Dean of High Performance Sport (Mr Shaun Bowie) or the Head Coach (Mr Mick Bennett).



Acceleration



VET

- Vocational pathway
- Suited to students who enjoy hands-on and experiential learning
- ▶ If you are considering ERPP or VCE-VM you should accelerate in a VET subject.

VCE

- Academic pathway
- Suited to highly academic students









- ➤ On Web Preferences, Year 10 students are eligible to select a VET acceleration from the approved subjects listed below.
- ► A maximum of ONE acceleration (VET or VCE) is allowed for Year 10 students. (Altior students may apply for more than one).
 - ► Cert II Bricklaying (1.30 5.00pm on Tuesday)
 - ► Cert II Carpentry (1:30 5:00 pm Tuesday; 7.30 11.00am on Thursday*)
 - ► Cert II Furniture Making Pathways (1.30 5.00pm on Tuesday)

- ► VET subjects may contribute to ATAR in Year 12. See Careers Advisors for further information.
- ► Students considering ERPP or VCE VM in Year 11 are advised to take up Bricklaying, Carpentry or Furniture.
- ➤ Other VET subjects are available (scored and non-scored) in Year 11, but they are not available for acceleration as a Year 10 student in 2026 (e.g. Cert II VET Sport and Recreation etc).

Discuss your VET options with Mr Torpey (AP - Partnerships and Pathways).





Acceleration in VCE means completing a Year 11 (Unit 1-2) subject while you are in Year 10.

Then, continuing that subject (Unit 3-4) while you are in Year 11.

- ► An accelerated VCE subject is year-long and will count as two (2) electives.
- ▶ All students in Year 10 will undertake Unit 1-2 of their chosen Religious Education subject. This is **not** considered acceleration.
- ▶ If you intend to accelerate into a Unit 3-4 subject at Year 11, you must do the Unit 1-2 equivalent next year.
- ▶ Altior students may apply for up to two accelerated subjects.

An accelerated study is more demanding than a Year 10 subject.

Conditions of enrolment:

- ► Performance in Year 10 subjects and electives is not negatively impacted.
- ► VCE subjects have one more lesson per cycle than Year 10 subjects. Therefore, students will miss one lesson per cycle of a Year 10 subject to attend their accelerated VCE subject.
- ▶ It is the expectation that students catch up on work missed and communicate regularly with their Year 10 teacher.







Selection criteria for acceleration into a VCE subject in Year 10 2026

- ▶ B grade or higher in **all** assessment tasks for English AND the most relevant subject studied in Year 9 Semester 1
- ► C grade or higher in all core subjects (RE, Maths, Humanities, Science) in Semester 1
- Semester 2 grades also meet the above criteria for related and non-related core subjects.
- Learning behaviours demonstrate a positive and committed work ethic.
- ▶ Timely submission of the correct application form.
- Recommendation of the LAL of the subject (via the acceleration review panel).



Continuation in an accelerated subject in Year 11 is **not** automatic, similar conditions apply.





Accelerating in Science (Unit 1-2 Biology or Psychology)

- ► This subject will count as your minimum two units of compulsory Science.
- ► If you wish to pursue another science in Year 11 you should also complete the appropriate pre-requisite at Year 10.

E.g.: apply to accelerate in Biology **and** wish to study Chemistry in VCE → select *Chemistry Matters* as Year 10.







Application

1. Collect a PINK application form from Ms Bonvicino (Dean of Learning) in MQ13

- 2. Complete all parts of the form including the nomination of two Year 10 subjects that will be replaced if your application is successful.
- 3. Return the completed form to the box out the front of MQ6 by Thursday, 14 August.







Outcome

- ► The decision on whether a student meets the criteria for acceleration is determined by a Panel. No one person decides on the outcome of each application.
- During Term 3, students will be notified via email the outcome of their application:
- Recommended: student meets all of the criteria
- 2. Pending: student may meet all or some of the criteria. A decision will be made in Term 4 after semester 2 examinations.
- 3. Not recommended: student does not meet all of the selection criteria.





PARADE COLLEGA PARADE COLLEGA PARADE TRADITIONES

- ► The College reserves the right to not to accelerate a student if they do not meet the guidelines for acceleration for that course and/or if the action is deemed to be in the best interests of that student.
- ► At Parade College, all students are required to have completed the relevant Unit 1-2 study before being able to accelerate into a Unit 3-4 subject.
- ▶ All students complete five Unit 3-4 subjects in Year 12. This includes students who complete acceleration in Year 11.
- Acceleration is not permitted in the following subjects*:
 - ► English, Literature, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Music Performance, Languages.

Using Web Preferences



- Pathway and Subjects are selected online using Web Preferences.
- An email with a link to Web Preferences, a code, and password is emailed to each student's Parade email account.
 - ➤ Search for <u>noreply@selectmysubjects.com.au</u> in your inbox
- ► There are four steps in the process:
- Log into Web Preferences
- 2. Select your subject preferences
- 3. Confirm your subject preferences
- 4. Sign your Web Preferences receipt digitally both student and parent signatures are required.






Signing the Web Preferences Receipt



- Student signature
- 2. Enter parent/guardian's email address.
- 3. Parent/guardian receives email and signs in a similar manner.
- 4. Both signatures should appear.
- 5. **Submit Signature** to confirm.



Parents should check their junk/spam folder for the email to sign the web preferences. Student preferences are still processed even in the absence of a parent signature. Parents do not receive an email to confirm that their signature 'worked'.

There is no advantage in submitting preferences early. All preferences will be considered equally, as long as they are submitted by the due date.
