### **About the Course**

This unit of competency specifies the mandatory work health and safety training required before undertaking construction work.

The unit requires the person to demonstrate personal awareness and knowledge of health and safety legislative requirements in order to work safely and prevent injury or harm to self and others.


It covers identifying and orally reporting common construction hazards, understanding basic risk control measures, and identifying procedures for responding to potential incidents and emergencies. It also covers correctly selecting and fitting common personal protective equipment (PPE) used for construction work.

- Satisfactory completion of Year 9 secondary school studies or higher and
- Satisfactory completion of a language, literacy, and numeracy test.

While Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) recognises the knowledge and skills you have gained through previous informal training, and past work and life experience.

If you think that you might be able to apply for CT or RPL, talk to the Assistant Principal – Partnership and Pathways preferably before course commencement.

### **Course Outcome:**

Students who satisfactorily complete all required training and assessment components of the unit will be issued with a Statement of Attainment. The RTO office will facilitate the application process for the Construction Induction (White card) with Worksafe Victoria once students complete the unit of competency, at no additional cost to the student

### **Further Training and Employment Pathways**


### **Further Training:**
