EQUIPMENT, PPE and UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS MUST BE BROUGHT TO EVERY FURNITURE MAKING CLASS

EQUIPMENT

- 6mm chisel
- 12mm chisel
- 25mm chisel
- Adjustable combination square 300mm
- 30/60 set square (for drawing)

UNIFORM

- Khaki Workpants / Overalls (**NO SHORTS**)
- Australian Standard Safety Glasses
- Earmuffs (**NO EAR PLUGS**)
- Steel Cap Safety work boots (**NO STEEL CAPPED RUNNERS**)
- Hi Visibility Work Shirt
 - **Parade Students** require a **YELLOW** Parade RTO Hi Vis Work Shirt from [Academy Uniforms](#)
 - **Parade Part Time Students** require an **ORANGE** Parade RTO Hi Vis Work Shirt from [Academy Uniforms](#)*
- Hi Visibility Jumper from [Academy Uniforms](#) (**NO HOODIES**)
 - **Parade Students** require a **YELLOW** Parade RTO Jumper from [Academy Uniforms](#)
 - **Parade Part Time Students** require an **ORANGE** Parade RTO Jumper from [Academy Uniforms](#)*

Beanies permitted in winter only

- Parade beanie (Parade students); Black or Navy Beanie (Parade Part Time students)
- **NO HOODIES PERMITTED**
- **NO SHORTS ARE PERMITTED, EVEN IN HOT WEATHER, DUE TO OH&S REQUIREMENTS**

Please note students who present to Class without their correct equipment and uniform will be excluded from practical class.

JEWELLERY

Stud/sleeper piercings, rings, bracelets and chains are not permitted. Precious/important jewellery is safer at home, away from possible accidental damage or loss. Students will be asked to remove jewellery and confiscated items will be placed in an envelope which can be collected at the end of the day.

*The Parade College RTO includes Full Time Parade Students and students who attend Parade for their VET class but have a different home school, ie: 'Parade Part Time' students'

GROOMING

Whilst Parade Part Time students are allowed to have long hair, hair length past their collar must be tied up and a hair net always worn whilst in the trade centre – this ruling applies to all students, male or female. Teachers can provide the hairnets to students upon request.

UNIFORM/PPE

For subjects that require a specific uniform as outlined in the Uniform/Equipment List – all students are required to always wear the correct uniform during their training – no exceptions unless due to medical reasons which requires prior approval. If a student is not wearing the correct PPE they will be sent home on their training day which can have an impact on their progress.
