Provide basic emergency life support



About the Course

Whether for work, sport, or leisure activities at home the ability to provide basic emergency life support can save someone's life. This course will provide you with an opportunity to gain the knowledge and skills required to provide an emergency response in a range of situations including community. Sport, event and workplace settings.

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to recognise and respond to life-threatening emergencies in line with first aid guidelines determined by the Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) and other Australian national peak clinical bodies.

This unit applies to all persons who may be required to provide an emergency response in a range of situations, including community and workplace settings.

Course Entry Requirements:

Course applicants must meet the following selection criteria

- Have the physical capacity to complete the practical requirements of the course.

Duration and Schedule

The course is completed in a one-day workshop and pre course reading.

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Training and assessment methods and location

Scheduled classes will be conducted at Parade College, Bundoora Campus.

Training will occur in two sequential parts

Part One:

Requires you to complete pre-course reading and a series of self-assessment questions. Required reading materials will be distributed prior to the training sessions.

<u>Part Two:</u>

Requires your attendance at a one-day training course. The session will include trainer led presentation, trainer practical skills demonstrations, and an opportunity for you to practice these skills in a simulated environment with training coaching and supervision

Assessment

A range of assessment methods are used throughout the course including a written test and practical skill demonstrations. You will receive detailed assessment information on commencement of the course.

Course Requirements

There is no specialist clothing, equipment or material requirements for this course.

Credit Transfer and Recognition of Prior Learning

Credit Transfer (CT) is the recognition by a registered training organisation (Parade College) of the qualifications, certificates and/or statements of attainment issued by other registered training organisations, universities and TAFEs. While Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) recognises the knowledge and skills you have gained through previous informal training, and past work and life experience.


If you think that you might be able to apply for CT or RPL, talk to the Executive Officer - RTO, preferably before course commencement.
