Academic Achievements 2020


Congratulations to the Class of 2020 and their dedicated teachers for achieving excellent VCE results.

Mater Amabilis – Mother Most Loving



Mater Amabilis (Mother Most Loving) circa 1850 artist unknown

One of the stories dear to the Founder and first Principal of the College, Br Ambrose Treacy, relates to a portrait from his birth town of Thurles in Ireland. This depiction of Mary originally hung in the parlour of the Christian Brothers School monastery in Thurles, County Tipperary, Ireland.

In the early 1850s Patrick Ambrose Treacy was a student at the Thurles school, and on visiting the monastery to speak with Br Francis Larkin, saw this picture and was moved by its beauty. Ambrose's resolution to become a Christian Brother was motivated by his strong devotion to Our Lady.

Many years later, during his first visit home to Ireland from Australia, the Director of the Brothers in Thurles gave him the portrait for Ambrose to take back to Australia as a treasured memento. For many years this painting held an honoured place in Victoria Parade, Melbourne – at that time, the motherhouse of the Christian Brothers in Australia.

After the Brothers moved from Victoria Parade, the painting was lost in the upheavals of shifting.

When Parade College assumed responsibility for the Brothers' residence in the 1990s, it was found rolled up in a cylindrical container in a cupboard in one of the rooms. It now hangs proudly in the College's Heritage Room.

We dedicate our 150th Year under the patronage of Mary – *Mother Most Loving.*

Year 9 ExCEL Program

Year 9 students will be involved in an ExCEL Orientation Day which will occur on either of the first two Wednesdays as part of your son's first Extended Learning Project (ELP) subject.

Families should be aware that ExCEL classes may be timetabled at either the Bundoora or Preston Campus and that changes to ExCEL subjects are not able to be made throughout the year.

Families will be able to determine which campus their son's ExCEL subject is based at from the room number on their sons SIMON timetable. Rooms commencing with 'R' or 'K' are located at the Preston Campus (eg; R14, K17) while all other room codes are located at the Bundoora Campus.

Semester One Timetables

Student timetables are built around maximising student's elective choices. At the end of the semester when students change their electives, many boys will also have a change of teacher for some of their year-long subjects in Semester 2. As students' programs become more elective-based, they understand that these changes become more necessary to accommodate their elective selections.

As such, except for compelling cases, students in Years 7 to 10 are not able to make changes to their elective subjects. Finding a subject no longer enjoyable or discovering it to be more challenging than expected are not considered compelling reasons for making changes to elective subjects. In such situations, it is preferable that students and their parents work with their son's teacher to support them through their learning.

Parent Portal – Medical Information

It is important that the College has the latest medical information for your son. Please take the time to review your son's medical information and update when required. All students will have an alert via PAM to validate medical information for 2021 with any current updates, enquiries to pamsupport@parade.vic.edu.au

Anaphylaxis - Epipens and Excursions

Parents of students that are at risk of Anaphylaxis should be aware that, in response to Ministerial Order 706, it is College policy and a requirement of legislation that students who attend the College must have supplied the College with a valid Epipen and a current Anaphylaxis Action Plan for their personal use.

In order for a student to attend an excursion or event off the premises they must carry their individual College Epipen and their spare Epipen from home with them in order to attend that event. This is to ensure that sufficient medications are available should the student require them.

Parents/carers are required to update their son's expired Epipen and Anaphylaxis Action Plan as soon as possible. Epipens and Action Plans need to be dropped at College Reception at both campuses.

If parents have specific enquiries about Epipens please contact Ms Ireland in First Aid at our Bundoora Campus.



Remember to take your Epipens with you when going on an excursion or to an event - if you forget your Epipen you can't leave the College

Asthma

It is advised for students who have asthma to carry their own reliever medication such as Ventolin in their pockets, however the College is able to supply Ventolin to a student who does not have their asthma medication and spacer on hand.

The administration of Ventolin is done after consulting your son's Asthma Action Plan from PAM. If your son does not have an asthma action plan and the situation is not deemed an emergency, the College will ring the parent/carer to have permission granted to administer the medication.

In the event of an asthma medical emergency and you have not supplied a current action plan, the First Aid Officer would follow emergency asthma care guidelines and an ambulance called.

Asthma Action Plans

It is important that the College has the latest medical information for your son. Unfortunately, there are a number of parents and carers who have not supplied a current Asthma Action Plan to their son's medical profile.

Parents/carers of students with Asthma are required to check their son's medical profile and ensure that they have supplied a current Asthma Action Plan signed by a Doctor to the College and have uploaded this plan to their son's medical profile on PAM.

Action and management plans for all significant health issues allow our First Aid Officers the ability to act quickly with the appropriate guidance to assist your son.

Students with other significant health issues are requested that their management plans for their condition are dropped off at Reception, which will be forwarded to the First Aid Officer.

Year 7 First Day 2021

Monday 1 February - 10.00am to 2.00pm The Year 7s will commence at their home campuses on Monday 1 February at 10.00am - Bundoora students will meet in Moore Hall and Preston students will meet in Penola Theatre.

- On the first day all Year 7's will need to bring their College Student Planner, laptop, and padlock for their locker.
- Students will need to wear their Summer College Uniform.
- School shoes are required to be made of hard, black, polishable leather – these provide greater protection than 'sports' style shoes.
- On Monday 1 February students will need to bring their lunch and snacks or alternatively the Canteen will be open for students to purchase lunch.
- Remember to make sure your son knows where to find you if you are picking him up at the end of his first day at 2.00pm.
- For the Photo Day on *Monday 8 February* the College tie and blazer is required, however on other days in Term 1 and 4 students can choose to wear his blazer to and from school as it is not compulsory.

Year 7 2021 Liturgy - Tuesday 2 February At 2.30pm on Tuesday 2 February the Year 7 and Year 12 students at both campuses will celebrate a Liturgy together to welcome our newest Paradians and to begin the process of handing on the traditions of our College.

Uniform

At Parade we value the tradition of wearing the College uniform well to honour all those men who have worn the purple, green and blue with pride and respect over the last 150 years

- Please check that your son has the correct College *Summer shirt* ready to go for Day 1. Winter shirts with or without tie are not permitted. College Summer shirts will only be worn for Terms 1 and 4.
- If your son chooses to wear a singlet under his shirt, please make sure that it is plain white – no logos, prints or colours.
- Grey Shorts or trousers can be worn in Term 1 dress shorts only – no elastic or drawstring waists.
- Jumpers and blazers go together to and from school! If your son wishes to wear his jumper to and from school, he must wear his blazer as well.
- Grey marle walk socks with black, hard, polishable leather shoes – no canvas shoes, or black leather 'sports-style' shoes. No black socks.
- Leave all *jewellery* at home no earrings, pierced jewellery (including clear plastic studs), necklaces, rings, bracelets, friendship bands, sports bands, or other bands to be worn. If it is precious or important in any way to your son, it is safer at home, away from possible accidental damage or loss.
- Hair should be neat, clean and in a business-like style, eg; no dreadlocks, braids, mohawks, 'Dusty-cuts', etc.
- If your son is shaving, please make sure that he is cleanshaven for school <u>each and every day</u>.

Please Note

All students in Years 7 to 12 at both campuses <u>must</u> wear College uniform to school on Monday 8 February for College photos <u>AND</u> bring their blazers and ties with them.

VCAL and VCE students should wear the grey Senior Tie for these photos which can be purchased from Academy Uniforms. There is a minimal number of ties available to purchase from Reception at both Campuses.

PE Uniform Changes From 2021

Students can choose whether to wear their tracksuits to school with their polo shirts and shorts on their designated PE Uniform day in each term. As we phase in the new tracksuits in 2021, both tracksuits styles will be acceptable PE wear. If your son does not have a full PE Uniform to wear to school on his designated PE Uniform Day, he must wear College Uniform to school and bring whatever items of PE Uniform he has with him in his bag to school and change for class. He should change back into College Uniform after his PE lesson in time for the rest of his classes and travelling home in the afternoon.

PE Uniform comprises the polo short, Parade shorts, white socks and runners. If any one of these items is missing, or unavailable on his designated PE Uniform Day - even if it is only white socks - then your son must wear his College Uniform that day. Your son can choose to wear his full tracksuit or track jacket or track pants with these basic items.

College Bus Network

At Parade we value respect for, and cooperation with, those whose job it is to get us safely to and from school each day

- At the time of writing this, COVID regulations still require students to wear masks on public transport in 2021.
 Students must have their face masks on as they enter the bus until they alight at school, and masks should be in place from school until they get off the bus on their way home.
- Students are not allowed to eat or drink on any of the buses to and from school - this is to assist the bus drivers to get to their next job on time, with a clean vehicle, or to help them complete their shifts on time at the end of the day, as well as ensuring a clean environment for all bus users;
- All young men are required to stay in their seats to and from school and wear the seat belts where these are provided as part of the students' responsibility for ensuring a safe trip for other passengers and the bus driver.
- Throwing any kind of material inside or outside the bus is a serious offence and will be treated as such. It is particularly distracting to bus drivers on very busy roads as well as disrespectful to the driver and fellow students.
- Noise levels should be kept to a reasonable level to allow bus drivers to concentrate on the task of getting students safely to their destinations.

- A MYKI card with appropriate funds is required for those students travelling on buses where a MYKI fare is required.
- Finally, cooperation with any directions given by bus drivers in the interests of passenger safety is always required from Parade students.

Public Transport

We expect all students to behave with courtesy and respect towards drivers and other passengers when using any form of public transport to and from school, and on excursions. We also expect students to stand and offer their seats to members of the public when using any form of public transport.

At the time of writing this, COVID regulations still require students to wear masks on public transport in 2021. Students must have their face masks on as they enter the bus, train, tram until they alight at school, and masks should be in place from school until they get off the bus, train, tram on their way home.



How to be a good passenger

- Be respectful to bus drivers and don't distract them while they are driving

 they have an important job to drive the bus safely.
- If you see something wrong, say something to the driver or call the police.
- Ensure people with special needs can access the priority area.
- When the bus is crowded please move towards the rear.
- Offer your seat to someone that needs it more than you do.
- If there's a seatbelt, wear it it's the law.
- Safely store your bags to reduce trip hazards.

BUS SAFETY - A SHARED RESPONSIBILITY.

Plenty Road and Bell Street

For students' safety, we require all students who need to cross Plenty Road or Bell Street, for any reason, to do so *at the lights* on the *marked pedestrian crossings*. The traffic lights at the entrance to the Bundoora Campus do not mark a pedestrian crossing and students should not attempt to cross Plenty Road at that point.

Bundoora Parents, please do not ask your son to meet you in the Hungry Jack's carpark, or drop him off there in the morning – the boys will always take the shortest way across the road, and there is no designated crossing from that point across Plenty Road

We would ask that parents emphasise this point with their sons so that students can remain safe as they cross two very busy roadways. Unfortunately, three years ago, one of our students was involved in an accident with a car, as he was not using a designated crossing. Fortunately, he recovered from that incident, but it is a reminder of how dangerous our roads can be.

We also expect students to obey traffic signals, teacher directions and instructions given by Parade staff and Council crossing supervisors.



How to Order Sibling Photos:

- 1. Families will be provided with a digital flyer by Parade College at the beginning on Term 1.

Student Drop Off Zones (refer map on page 19)


Students using any PTV service including College PTV buses must carry and be able to present an in-credit MYKI card.


