#### **Traffic and Parking**

My name is Jacob Williams and I am especially excited to lead our Wellbeing Team this year as the newly appointed Assistant Principal – Student Wellbeing. I have been a part of the Parade College community for many years and I am very grateful to work alongside our families to support our young Paradians throughout their secondary education.

As a father of three, I understand the privileged position I am in to assist you and your sons in their schooling journey. Please don't hesitate to seek support whenever you need - Tutor Teachers, House Leaders, Student Wellbeing Coordinators, Deans of Students, Counsellors, Youth Workers, and Subject Teachers. All of our staff are on hand to assist you and your son with a smooth transition to the College.

There are so many things to discover and try at Parade and we hope your sons find their interests and passions and follow them during their journey with us. We encourage you to remind your sons to check the Student Bulletin each day for group memberships to clubs, activities, and promotions right across the College.

This will help to make their secondary school experience a more personal one.

The best advice we can give our newest members of the College is to take advantage of all opportunities offered as this will help with the transition, making new friends, and connecting to the College on many different levels.

#### Year 7 2024 Families

Our newest Paradians attended the Orientation Sessions for the 2024 Year 7s in December last year. Tutor Teachers and House Leaders had a great time getting to know the students and enjoyed their company. We hope our Year 7s first day on Thursday 1 February is equally as exciting and reassuring for them.

We know transition to a new school can be a time of great trepidation for students and their families, so here are some important upcoming events and dates for the beginning of the 2024 year.

Please remember we are all here to assist and your son's Tutor Teacher and House Leader are a wealth of information should you have any concerns or questions.

#### **Year 7 First Day**

#### Thursday 1 February 8.35am to 3.15pm

The Year 7s will commence on Thursday 1 February at 8.35am in Moore Hall. Parents who are driving their son, are requested to please safely drop them off in the designated drop-off areas where they will be met by a member of staff who will assist them to Moore Hall. Please follow the directions of our traffic wardens.

On the first day, all Year 7s need to bring their own exercise books for subjects, pens, stationery, laptop and padlock for their locker.

Year 7s have Sport each Thursday after lunch, although for their first day, Thursday 1 February, students are required to be in their summer academic uniform. All Year 7 families were emailed this information on 7 December 2023.

College Summer Uniform will also be worn on Friday 2 February. Please note, school shoes are required to be made of hard, black, polishable leather as these provide greater protection than 'sports' style shoes.

Students will need to bring their morning tea and lunch or alternatively the Canteen will be open for students to purchase lunch.

#### Failte Liturgy 2024

#### Thursday 1 February 2.25pm to 3.15pm

On the first day we have the Fáilte Liturgy where we recognise Year 7 and Year 12 mentors. This Liturgy welcomes our newest Paradians, recognises their work with

their Year 12 mentor, and begins the process of handing on the traditions of our College.

Year 7 parents and carers are very welcome to join the students and staff in Moore Hall at Bundoora. Please arrive early to ensure we can begin on time. The Liturgy will commence at 2.25pm and conclude at 3.15pm. All Year 7s will then be dismissed and able to make their way home with parents or on the buses, trains, trams.

#### Uniform

At Parade, we value the tradition of wearing the College uniform well, to honour all those students who have worn the purple, green and blue with pride and respect over the last 150 years.

All families have received updated communication regarding the College's expectations regarding the correct wearing of the uniform and students' general appearance.

#### All Day Absence, Early Departure, or Late Arrival

Please see below the process to record All Day Absence, Early Departure, or Late Arrivals on PAM.

All Day absences must be recorded on PAM (Parent Access Module) each morning students are away. If no reason is given, parents will receive a SMS text message around 11.30am reminding them to log into PAM to record the reason for their son's absence. Late arrivals and early departures must be recorded by families through PAM. There is NO absence phone line and students signing in late or leaving early will need to have had this recorded on PAM in advance. This will ensure our records are accruate.



If your son is arriving late or leaving early, this needs to be recorded on PAM as mentioned above. This can be found in the

Once you click on the Parent Notified Absences icon, you will click arriving late or leaving early (see below). Once submitted this entry appears on your son's electronic roll and alerts Student Services. There is no need to provide a hand-written note. Your son will simply head to Student Services to Officially sign in Jout.

#### From the First Aid Office

Please ensure student medical information is entered online via the parent portal to assist us in providing the most appropriate care.

Parents and carers must let the College know immediately if your son develops chicken pox/varicella, shingles, or measles. Other students may be receiving medical treatment which increases the risk of complications from these infectious illnesses.

Students sometimes suffer from illness or injury during the school day. Parents will be contacted when necessary and may be asked to collect students from school. We do not have the capacity to care for students throughout the day when they are not fit to participate in their usual school activities.

Exceptions to this include students who are undergoing rehabilitation and transitioning back to school after absence, and students managing chronic illnesses.

Parents and carers, please keep your contact phone numbers up to date, including a third contact person for times when you are unavailable.

#### **Anaphylaxis – Epi-Pens and Excursions**

Parents and carers of students who are at risk of Anaphylaxis should be aware that, in response to Ministerial Order 706, it is College policy and a requirement of legislation that students who attend the College must have supplied the College with a valid Epi-Pen and a current Anaphylaxis Action Plan for their personal use.

In order for a student to attend an excursion or event off the premises they must carry their individual College Epi-Pen and their spare Epi-Pen from home in order to attend that event. This is to ensure that sufficient medications are available should the student require them.

Parents and carers are required to update their son's expired Epi-Pen and Anaphylaxis Action Plan as soon

as possible. Epi-Pens need to be dropped at Student Reception and Action Plans need to be uploaded to PAM.

#### **Asthma**

It is usual for students who have asthma to carry their own reliever medication such as Ventolin in their pockets, however the College is able to supply Ventolin to a student who does not have their asthma medication and spacer on hand.

The administration of Ventolin is done after consulting your son's Asthma Action Plan from PAM. In the event of an asthma medical emergency and you have not supplied a current Action Plan, the First Aid Officer would follow emergency asthma care guidelines and an ambulance called.

#### **Asthma Action Plans**

It is important that the College has the latest medical information for your son.

Unfortunately, there are a number of parents and carers who have not supplied a current Asthma Action Plan to their son's medical profile.

Parents and carers of students with asthma are requested that they check their son's medical profile and ensure that they have supplied a current Asthma Action Plan signed by a Doctor and have uploaded this plan to their son's medical profile on PAM. This will allow our First Aid Officers the ability to act quickly with the appropriate guidance to assist your son.

#### Medication

The College cannot provide medication (including Paracetamol, Aspirin, Ibuprofen, etc). Students who require medication during the day (headaches, pain relief) must provide their own supplies, which may be stored in the First Aid Room, to be accessed as required. Parents will also be required to complete a Medication Authority Form available from the First Aid Office.

Students with other significant health issues are requested that their Management Plans for their condition are dropped off at Reception which will be forwarded to the First Aid Officer.

Please feel free to contact the First Aid Officer for any enquiries regarding significant or complex health needs.

#### From the Assistant Principal - Teaching & Learning

To all our students and their families, we extend a warm welcome, especially to our new Year 7 cohort, who are not only beginning their high school adventure but also becoming part of the rich Parade tradition.

For our Year 12 students, 2024 marks the final chapter of their secondary schooling.

They will be engaging in the Victorian Certificate of Education through two distinct pathways: the VCE or the VCE Vocational Major (VM).

The VCE aims to facilitate a transition to tertiary study, offering the possibility of an ATAR, while the VCE VM pathway offers a more tailored applied learning approach.

This pathway equips our students with essential skills for success in further studies, apprenticeships, traineeships, and the workforce.

# **Bundoora Campus Traffic Arrangements**

In the Interests of Student Safety;

- Please observe all speed zones and traffic management signage whilst on College grounds
- Please follow directions by traffic marshals and parking attendants
- There is a strict no standing rule for all vehicles anywhere along the College Driveway

#### **Morning Student Drop off Zones**

The College has two convenient zones for students to be dropped off at the Bundoora Campus: Garvey Terrace and ERC carpark.

#### **Garvey Terrace**

Vehicles entering the main driveway from Plenty Rd may drop students at Garvey Terrace. Drop off only, no standing zone.

#### **ERC Carpark**

Vehicles entering via Milton Parade may drop off students at the ERC carpark between 7.00am and 9.00am. Please refer to the map on page 23.

#### **Afternoon Student Pick up Zones**

The College has two convenient zones where vehicles may park, to collect students at the end of the school day from the Bundoora Campus: Garvey Terrace II and ERC carparks.

#### **Garvey Terrace II**

Vehicles entering the main driveway from Plenty Rd may park in the Garvey Terrace II and Garvey Oval carparks.

Vehicles may exit left via Garvey Oval exit, prior to 3.30pm. Vehicles may only exit through the Visitor's carpark and main drive once all buses have departed, at 3.30pm.

#### **ERC Carpark**

Enter via Milton Parade. Carpark open from 3.00pm to 3.35pm

The Bundoora main driveway will be staffed at the beginning of the school year to assist you.

#### **Bus Bays**

Please take note of your afternoon bus pick-up point. The following buses will be parked on the main bus circuit:

ABCDEFGHJ1&2KLMN

The following buses will be parked in Garvey Terrace:

A2 PCF P Q R T

The following buses will enter and pick-up in the bus circuit once all other buses depart.

B2 from bay B

W from bay D

Y from bay E

X1&2 from bay F

#### **Bus Information**

- Please check the latest routes and timetables prior to beginning of the school year as some have changed.
- Parade buses use public bus stops along all bus routes.
- Be at your bus stop and visible to the bus driver 10 mins prior to the timetabled time.
- Do not wait inside a car as this makes it difficult for bus drivers to identify students.

#### 2024 Bus Services

If you were on a College Charter or PTV bus in 2023, and you wish to remain on the same bus in 2024, you do not need to reapply. The 2023 Bus Pass is valid in 2024 until new Student ID cards are issued during Term 1.

Students who have applied for a 2024 bus service, including 2024 enrolments, will receive a letter confirming their bus route/routes.

This letter may be used to catch buses during the first week of school. Bus Passes will be handed out by Tutor Teachers at commencement of on-site classes.

#### **MYKI**

Students using any PTV service, including College PTV buses, must carry and be able to present an in-credit MYKI card. Students are required to tap on at the beginning of each journey and tap off when alighting the bus at their destination.




