Road to Reconciliation 2018

On Wednesday 30 May Parade College hosted our second "Road to Reconciliation" event. We welcomed students from St Kevin's College Toorak, St Joseph's College Geelong, St Patrick's College Ballarat, Santa Maria College Northcote, Mercy College Coburg, and St Pius X Primary School West Heidelberg.

The day began in the Indigenous Garden where our College Torchbearer for 2018, Jamaica IIsley (Year 12 L08), welcomed everyone to Parade, and Uncle Trevor Gallagher acknowledged the original owners of the land, the Wurrundjeri people.

A highlight of the day included a keynote presentation from Sherry Balcombe from Aboriginal Catholic Ministry. Students and staff were moved and challenged by her presentation which outlined some of injustices of the past, including those that happened in her own family.

As well as group work, where the students shared reflections and ideas, we also had a panel of distinguished people, including Old Paradians Matthew and Jayden Lyllist and Evajo Edwards and Muriel Bamblett from the Victorian Aboriginal Childcare Agency. The panel discussion was facilitated by senior Aboriginal student and event organiser, Rylie Cadd (Year 11 T02). The students asked some thought provoking questions and, as a large proportion of them were Aboriginal, the panel encouraged students to be their best selves and to take on leadership roles in their communities.

These past students were the ones who chose the hospital as the major beneficiary of Parade College fundraising efforts for 2017-18.

Last year the Parade community raised \$35,000.00 for the hospital, which went towards the installation of a solar power system.

Dr Daniel Doyle, who has visited the hospital several times and who liaises with the Edmund Rice Foundation about the needs of the hospital, discussed that the solar system means that with reliable power, the hospital no longer has to function by torchlight. He described women giving birth with only a torch to light the room.

Dr Daniel also discussed his passion for building an operating theatre at the hospital, so that people in the region will no longer die of curable conditions such as appendicitis or obstructed births.

The 2018 Prefect Team is determined to raise \$50,000.00 to celebrate 50 years at Bundoora campus, and will be doing their best to mobilise the support of the entire community for the Solidarity Walk on Friday 24 August.

Night of Excellence

The ancient past came to Parade College at the Night of Excellence on the evening of 22 May when the students of Year 7 Altior Humanities presented to parents, families, and staff of Parade College, a history of ancient Rome from its origins to the fall of the Western Empire.

In a little over two hours, each student provided a snapshot of over a thousand years of history examining the early foundations of Rome, through its period of kings, exploring Republican Rome and then investigating the ascendency of Imperial Rome before its downfall in 476CE.

Not only did the students provide a chronological history of Rome they also created their own display stations on an aspect of Roman society, history, culture or technology that engaged them.



Students created a range of interesting displays from dioramas of the Seven Hills of Rome, a model of an aqueduct to an examination of representations of Rome in modern cinema. It would be true to say that for the 'friends, Romans and countrymen' (and women) who lent their ears on that evening, many would have come away learning a bit more about the ancient past!



If there is something I have learned, it is that the way we should act in the world is in a way that makes people's lives better in some small way. This is the learning I gained from my experience in an aged care facility, and I will remember as one of the most important learning experiences of Year 10.



Students have been encouraged to begin looking for placements and the activities in their Careers class over the next term should help to provide further ideas for students unsure about what they might like to explore as possible future career options.

Work Experience provides an excellent opportunity for young people to get a sense of the workplace and professions that they are considering and interested in learning more about. In a time where working roles and environments are constantly changing, the opportunity to engage with real working experiences can be so powerful for young people trying to navigate their own futures. Teenagers, Sport and Gambling

For young people, gambling is not always about money. Instead, it can be about fun, excitement or social acceptance. In more recent times, gambling has been promoted as an integral part of sport with gambling ads regularly sprinkled through sports broadcasts. In March this year, the Federal Government announced the prohibition of gambling ads during all live sports broadcasts between 5.00am and 8.30pm in order to reduce the exposure of these ads to children and young people. This decision came in light of the following facts and figures:

- Gambling advertising creates a misconception among teenagers that gambling is a normal part of sport
- Exposure to gambling advertising is higher for 13 to 17 year olds than for adults
- One in five adults with gambling problems started gambling before they were 18
- Around 4% of teenagers have a problem with gambling

Here are some signs that a teenager might be having problems with gambling:

- Showing signs of depression including isolation from friends
- Obsession with simulated gambling apps and games
- Spending lots of time talking or thinking about gambling
- Experiencing mood swings, feeling stressed when not gambling
- Issues at home around gambling
- Obsessing about odds when watching sport instead of focusing on the game
- Lying or being secretive about gambling activities
- Missing school or grades falling due to time spent gambling
- Borrowing or taking money from family and friends
- Continuing to gamble to win back money they have lost

'Love the Game' is an initiative of the Victorian Responsible Gambling Foundation to prevent the cycle of gamblingrelated harm that can start at a young age. Parents have an important role when it comes to prevention:

- Instead of talking about odds, talk about the love of the game and who is (or isn't) performing on the field
- Have conversations with your son about gambling (go to kidbet.com.au for some conversation starters as well as facts and figures)
- For most people, most of the time, gambling is innocent fun with no negative consequences: If you like a flutter, demonstrate responsible gambling
