Semester Two Timetables

Students have begun their second semester timetables. At Parade, our timetable is focused on students, not teachers. When our boys make their elective choices, we maximise their choices and build the timetable around them. This means that at the end of a Semester, students change their electives and to accommodate these changes there are many boys who also have a change for some of their year-long (two semester) subjects. Teachers will assist students in making this transition, and as students progress through the school, they will find as they can choose electives more and more, this changes becomes more common.

All students are encouraged to take time during the upcoming semester break to have a rest in preparation for the new term and to celebrate all that they have achieved. Senior students will have homework and study tasks to focus on that help them to appreciate the times of rest all the more.

Year 12 Oral SACs

Year 12 English students are preparing for their upcoming Year 12 English Oral SAC 'Presenting Argument'. They will deliver the oral presentation in week one or two of Term Three. Students have been assigned a time when they will be removed from their usual English class to deliver the oral presentation in Banksia Room in front of an assessor and five other students. Students have been informed of their allocated time by their English teacher and it is also published on eWorkspace. Students are advised to rehearse their presentations at home, ideally in front of an audience. In this time, students should also be re-reading their English texts, with a focus on *Tracks*, which is the next unit after the Oral SAC.

2019 Subject Selection Information

The email contains your son's individualised details for Web Preferences, with instructions and a link for accessing subject details on the Subject Selection section of the Parent Portal. The subject selection assemblies and evening address all of the subject offerings, prerequisites, completion of the online form etc. The sessions are most important as it is imperative that your son chooses his subjects wisely. We ask all parents of Year 9 and 10 students to attend the evening with their son(s).

At the Subject Selection Evening on 2 August, College staff will be available before and after each session to answer any queries that may arise about 2019 Year 10 and Year 11 courses. They will be allocated to Learning Areas in the College Hall, and will be able to assist with any matters that may need clarification.

In addition, representatives from tertiary institutions will be present and available to Year 9 to 12 families. While the formal presentations in Rivergum Theatre and The Atrium are aimed at current Year 9 and 10 families, Year 11 and 12 families, while not required to attend this evening, are encouraged to make the most of the opportunity to discuss courses with tertiary representatives exclusively from 3.30pm to 5.00pm. The remaining times are designated for current Year 9 and 10 families.

We look forward to meeting with Year 9 and 10 families at the Subject Selection Evening on 2 August.


Epipens and Excursions

Every Little Bit Counts

A Native American saying goes "We don't inherit the Earth from our ancestors; we borrow it from our grandchildren".

This week at Parade we are all being challenged to consider what sort of world we want to leave for our grandchildren and great grandchildren.

Sometimes it all seems too hard. It seems like the problem is too big and our lifestyles rely too heavily on plastic and other fossil-fuelled convenience.



In the spirit of Mahatma Ghandi however, we can *be the change* we want to see in the world.

If many of us make small changes, we will not only feel more hopeful for the future, we will be an example to others who might follow and we will send an important message to government, that this is important to our community.

So, what are some of the little things we can do?

 Cut down on our use of plastic that we only use once eg. Cling wrap, plastic bags, straws, plastic cutlery, disposable plastic containers and disposable drink bottles. Instead, go "nude" with our food, bringing it in reusable containers and bringing cutlery from home. If going nude is not an option, wrap sandwiches and other food in greaseproof paper or put in brown paper bags.

- Bring a reusable water bottle rather than throw away bottles.
- Buy snacks in bulk and then divide into small containers or paper bags to avoid the use of the convenient packaging that potato chips and other snacks come in.

We would love to be able to halve the amount of rubbish we are producing at Parade and we appreciate all of the small efforts members of our community make.

Environment Week At Parade

'Everyone Can Make a Difference'

Along the existential lines of poverty and conflict, the sustainability of our planet presents itself as one of the most complex and concerning issues of our time.

A significant aspect of that issue is plastic in our society. That is, our dependence on it despite us knowing that it comes from finite fossil fuels. Plastics take many years to decompose once discarded, ending up in our most sacred sites – oceans, forests and someone's home. The United Nations reports that annually over 8 million tonnes of plastic end up in our sea.

This week at Parade College is *Environment Week* in which we come together to recognise the challenge that confronts our planet. One of the most fundamental ways to address the issue is through awareness of one's relationship with the environment – to demonstrate why we should take interest and make transformative decisions.

For several years, the Advocacy Team has been undertaking campaigns to promote awareness of this issue including *Environment Week*. From discussions and activities integrated in classes to the upcoming visit by the Shadow Minister for Education Andrew Giles (MP for Scullin) to provide his perspective on the matter, we are striving to foster a mindset where care for the planet is considered when we make all of our decisions.

The theme for the week is 'Everyone Can Make a Difference,' in reference to how every conscious decision for our planet, no matter how seemingly small, can culminate in greater effort to solve this problem by the reduction of plastic dependency and in search for alternatives.

The time has come and we are at a crossroads in choosing paths that may very well have irreversible consequences for all.



It is a choice between the path to a deserted wilderness or to a land of natural wonders for our future generations. It is a common issue, the earth as our mutual home, which requires a shared response - something from which we cannot simply opt-out.

The great English naturalist and broadcaster, David Attenborough, in his documentary Blue Planet II, once recalled of a "heartbreaking" moment of witnessing an albatross feed its young a plastic toothpick only for it to die from it. As the carers of the world, rather than starving its life, we must endeavour to fight for its preservation – as a candle of its existence against the darkness of space.

May we all rise to that challenge.







World Scholars' Cup

Over the weekend of 25 and 26 May, eighteen students from Parade College joined with nearly three hundred other students at Genazzano College in Kew to participate in the 2018 Melbourne Round of World Scholars' Cup. The teams from Parade College consisted of students from Years 8 to 11, with a few boys participating for the first time.

World Scholars' Cup is an international team academic program with students participating from over the world. The World Scholar's Cup has attracted what it calls "a global community of future scholars and leaders", and promotes that it allows participants to "discover strengths and skills you never knew you had." It focuses on bringing students from different cultures together to discuss issues and ideas relevant to today. Successful teams can earn the right to attend the Tournament of Champions at Yale University in November.

Students work in teams and individually in a series of activities such as a Team Debate, Collaborative Writing and the Scholars Bowl, which is a multiple choice team competition. This year all six teams from Parade College have been invited to participate in the Global round in Melbourne in August.

Old Paradians the Rev Father Joseph Caddy (1977) and Anthony McAleer (1983) have both been recognised in the 2018 Queen's Birthday Honours list.



Ordained in 1990, Fr Joe (pictured above) was awarded an Order of Australia Medal (AM) in the General Division for "significant service to the community through a range of social welfare initiatives and policy reforms, and to the Catholic Church in Australia", and Anthony an OAM "for service to the community and military history".

Fr Joe is Episcopal Vicar for Social Services in the Melbourne Archdiocese, the former CEO of CatholicCare in Melbourne, and is presently parish priest at St Mary's in East St Kilda. Apart from his academic qualifications of Bachelor of Theology (Melbourne), Fr Joe holds degrees in Social Sciences from the Gregorian University Rome, where he focused his studies on Catholic social teaching and social ethics and economics.

"Australia is a wonderful country and so it is a huge privilege to receive this award. In a way it is a recognition of all those who work in the Church and its agencies for a fairer society, especially for those who are poor or in any way disadvantaged," Fr Joe said.

"While I am enormously honoured to receive this recognition I would be even more pleased to see our Australian society step up do more for those who are in need.

"We are a generous and big hearted people but at times our policies towards those who are seeking asylum or who find themselves unemployed are unnecessarily mean. We lock increasing numbers of our indigenous brothers and sisters and our poor in prisons which fail to improve their life chances or make our communities safer.

"We can do better on many fronts and I am sure that as a nation we truly want a fair go for all."

Through his involvement with Mt Evelyn and Lilydale RSLs, as a committee member on the Seville War Memorial Committee, author of several books on local and military history, and through numerous talks with school and other groups, Anthony has brought focus the personal stories and bigger picture of Yarra Ranges' military history.

For the 1997 Yarra Ranges Shire Citizen of the Year, and recipient of the Centenary of Federation Award, the award is overwhelmingly a great honour.

"It certainly gives a big tick to some of the stuff I've been able to achieve over the years, and not just the written histories," Anthony told the *Yarra Valley Mail*.

"It's also the material collected for archives, the memorials we've created, the ceremonies, working with schools and other groups, and this is recognition that it's appreciated."

Anthony's commitment to community as a volunteer and as a researcher in military history commenced around 1990 through his involvement with Lilydale RSL and Lilydale & District Historical Society. He has served as secretary of Mount Evelyn RSL since 2002, is editor and producer of its monthly newsletter, and is a member of the Mount Evelyn History Group. He also serves Museums Victoria as team leader and tour guide at the Immigration Museum.

"I've always had an interest in Australian history, and especially Australian military history and that sparked my curiosity around what happened locally – how did that broader heritage affect the area that I'm living in, and what part did this area play in Australia's military history?," Anthony said. "I started to scratch away and it and it was just extraordinary."

90 Years young - OP's roll out new blue strip

Pictured recently being chaired from the field by Will Gilmore (2012) and Jake Plunkett (2012) is Marcus Nolan (2012), basking in the afterglow of the Old Paradians' 23point victory over Eltham College and their ninth win from as many starts.



This was a history-making moment in more ways than one for Marcus, who completed game No.100 for the OPs on a day in which all members of the senior 22 sported the football club's newly-adopted alternative strip for the first time. As part of a VAFA directive, the Old Paradians were required to provide an alternative to the familiar emerald green guernsey with purple trim, to prevent clashes with opposition teams like the Turtles who also carry green and who hosted the OPs at Eltham on this occasion.

The club, in its wisdom, opted to go back to the future, replicating the dark navy guernsey with purple and green horizontal band across the chest – in keeping with the design adopted in the foundation season of 1929 when the likes of Bryan Cosgrave (1922) and Allan La Fontaine first took to the field for the old boys.

After the match, Marcus, a member of the OPs' 2015 D2 Premiership team in what was his first season of senior footy, commended the club for its "back to the future" call on the alternative strip.

"I love this guernsey. It's sharp and it's bold," Marcus said. "There's also the heritage aspect, as we're all familiar with the '29 team photograph hanging in the rooms, where all those players of yesteryear are wearing the dark navy woollen guernseys.

"What was also good about wearing the alternative strip was that it gave me a chance to wear a different number – No.10 today as opposed to the usual No.30 – because the larger numbers reflected the larger guernsey sizes."

A long-term injury to captain Chris Kandilakis (2008), along with the World Cup departures of the jet setting McCann brothers Andrew (2014) and Luke (2012), Keenan Posar and Matt Mahony (2012), meant that a number of changes were forced for the Eltham match . . . but crisis creates opportunity as Marcus observed.

"I still feel like a young bloke out there to be honest, but it's good to see a few younger blokes coming through," he said. "A couple of Unders players stepped up for this game as senior debutants and hopefully they can continue to fulfil their roles and slot in nicely."

10 Years on, "some things never change"

Fifty-four members of the final year class of 2008 recently gathered in the Hickey Foyer, ten years after they completed their schooling at the Bundoora Campus.

Joining former students at the 10-year reunion were teachers John Cornish, Carla Di Vito and Jim Seymour, together with the Principal Dr Denis Moore.



Chris Sullivan, the 2008 Parade Captain who addressed the reunion gathering, spoke for all his College contemporaries when he said it was as if they'd never left.

"Things basically picked up from where they left off – it was as if the ten years had gone in the blink of an eye," Chris said in the aftermath of the reunion. "A lot of the banter continued, similar to what is was in 2008. Some things never change.

Beyond the Hickey Foyer, the former students gathered at the Frank Mount Social Room at the Garvey Oval, to share memories of a special time in their lives.
