



From the Principal

At this stage of the term students at Year levels 7 to 11 are in the process of making subject selections for 2020. When this is complete we begin the complicated task of preparing classes and timetabling for next year. There is an important event this Thursday afternoon/evening regarding subject selection for current Year 9 and 10 students to help them and their parents make wise selections of courses. Details appear later in this *Newsletter*.

There are a number of other significant events this term. The Father/Carer and Son Winter Games Night takes place on Monday 12 August. Details for booking are in this *Newsletter*, but places are limited so book early. The Annual Fathers' Day Breakfast is scheduled for the morning of Wednesday 28 August in the Yarangabee Centre. Bookings for both events must be made via Trybooking.

A reminder that Parade and Mercy College students are presenting a very entertaining play based on Shakespeare's classic play *A Midsummer Night's Dream* from 29 to 31 August. Details of booking procedures are on page 7 in this *Newsletter.*

The College is currently reviewing and updating the Master Plan. The purpose of master planning is to look to the future of Parade College in the context of our history, culture and values. It will establish the guidelines by which we foster campuses of learning that will endure into our next 150 years. One of the areas that has become evident is the need to update our student toilet facilities at both campuses. We have begun this process at the Bundoora Campus in the

oldest part of the school, the Mt Sion Building, and will gradually roll out the program to Preston and the remaining Bundoora areas.

On Monday, the staff participated in an excellent professional development day focused on Mission and Catholic Identity organised by Parade's Ministry Team. We were blessed with three presenters: Dr Carmody Grey who is the Assistant Professor of Catholic Theology at the Centre for Catholic Studies, University of Durham, UK; and Darby Carr and Mary Flaskas from *Inclusivity Consultants*. Carmody explored the notion of God as Communion and the implications for Parade College as a Catholic School in the Edmund Rice Tradition. Darby and Mary worked with staff to assist us in creating a safe and supportive learning environment for LGBTIQ students.

Please remember that the second Working Bee for the College takes place at each campus on Sunday morning 18 August. All contributions will be welcome.

Please note that, except for ERPP and VCAL students, every current Years 7, 8 and 11 student received a personalised Subject Selection email at 2.00pm on 26 July. Years 9 and 10 students will receive their email on 2 August.

The email contains your son's individualised details for Web Preferences, with instructions and a link for accessing subject details on the Subject Selection section of PAM.

The subject selection assemblies and evening address all of the subject offerings, prerequisites, completion of the online form, etc. The sessions are most important as it is imperative that your son chooses his subjects wisely. Except for ERPP and VCAL students, we ask all parents of Year 9 and 10 students to attend the evening with their son.

At the Subject Selection Evening on 1 August, College staff will be available before and after each session to answer any queries that may arise about 2020 Year 10 and Year 11 courses. They will be allocated to Learning Areas in the College Hall and will be able to assist with any matters that may need clarification.

In addition, representatives from tertiary institutions will be present and available at a **VCE and Tertiary Expo** to Year 9 to Year 12 families.

While the formal presentations are aimed at current Year 9 and 10 families, Year 11 and 12 families are encouraged to make the most of the opportunity to discuss courses with tertiary representatives exclusively from 3.30pm to 4.30pm. The remaining times are designated for current Year 9 and 10 families.

We look forward to your attendance at the Subject Selection Evening on 1 August.





For students

Carpentry Students 'Nail it Again'

Recently the Parade Trade Centre Team were involved in a Community Action project for St Pius X Primary School in Waterdale Road, Heidelberg.

The Trade Centre Carpentry Team was approached by school Gardening Coordinator Kylie Johnston and asked if they could build four planter boxes for the school community garden

Under the guidance and direction of Trade Centre Teacher Simon Hogan, the students again stepped up to the plate, eager to help in any way possible.

The students followed the practices from their unit of work CPCCCM1012A 'Work Effectively and Sustainably in the Construction Industry', where they were extremely environmentally conscious and used recycled corrugated iron donated by James Hunt from the Parade Plumbing Department.

The timber structure of the planter boxes was standard 75 x 35mm MGP F5 radiate pine. These timber structures will be painted with Wattyl Solar Guard paint to protect them from the elements.

Earlier this year, Public Transport Victoria (PTV) and Yarra Trams upgraded Stop 71 on Route 86 at Plenty Road, Bundoora.

To finish our upgrades, we will be installing a new guard rail, extending the concrete maintenance strip, repairing the footpath and completing landscaping.

Work will take place from 9pm Sunday 4 August to 10pm Friday 16 August 2019, close to the new tram stop on Plenty Road between McKimmies Road and College Street.

- Some medium levels of noise associated with this work.
- Temporary lane closures.
- Temporary pedestrian detours around the work site.

From the Director of High Performance Sport

Parade Students Continue to Excel on the Sporting Field

Congratulations to the following students on their outstanding sporting achievements:

Year 11 student Jai Lemire Yr11 L07 represented Victoria and was Vice Captain at the recent Indoor Cricket National Championships. Victoria won the event and Jai was named player of the Tournament. Jai's performance behind the stumps and with the bat was outstanding throughout the entire competition. As a result of his efforts, he was also named in the Australian All Star Team.



It was mentioned in a previous newsletter that Year 9 student, Kobe Knight (T16), was named in the AFL Indigenous Flying Boomerangs National Under 15 Squad of fifty players which played against one another in a trial game at the GMHBA stadium earlier this year. Due to his performance at this trial, Kobe was then selected to be part of the



twenty-five National Player Squad which trialled again earlier in July. From these trials, ten to twelve Boomerang players will join the World Team Program to form an All Stars Team in November.

2020 ACC High Performance Sport Classes – Years' 8 to 10

To play ACC Sport in Years 8, 9 or 10 in 2020 at the Bundoora campus, students should be in an ACC High Performance class. If your son didn't play one of the specific sports listed below in 2019, but would like to be considered for that sport in 2020 and a place in an ACC High Performance Class, then he should attend the following trials -

Cricket

Bundoora College Cricket Nets 2 August after school 3:30pm - 4:30pm

Tennis

Bunjil Park Tennis Courts 7 August and 9 August after school 3.30pm – 4.30pm

These trials are used to assess the students' abilities and possible selection into an ACC High Performance class in 2020 and are for students currently in Years' 7, 8 and 9 who didn't make a specific ACC team in 2019.

Students are asked to wear their sports uniform for the trials.

Please note, students who have played a specific ACC sport in 2019 are not required to attend the trials for that specific sport, as their performance throughout the ACC season is used to assess their possible selection into an ACC High Performance class for 2020.

However, if for example, a student played football in 2019, but didn't make the basketball team, and would like to be considered for the basketball team in 2020, then they must attend the basketball trials.

Listed below are some questions and responses that may assist in the understanding how ACC High Performance is conducted at the College.

How does a student get into an ACC High Performance Class?

When selecting subjects for 2020, students who wish to play either football or soccer must select ACC High Performance – Semester 1 as part of their subject selection.

Students wishing to play either, Basketball, Table Tennis, Hockey, Cricket Tennis or Volleyball must select ACC High Performance Semester 2 as part of their subject selection.

If a student wishes to play a sport in Semester 1 and 2 then they must selection ACC High Performance – Semesters' 1 and 2. Please note, whilst a student may select to do ACC High Performance Sport, this does not guarantee them a position in the class. The number of students wishing to be involved in the subject is far greater than the number of positions available and as a consequence, students are selected into the subject based on a combination of some or all of the following criteria;

- Previous ACC involvement and performance
- Involvement and performance in regular Physical Education classes
- General behaviour and ability to demonstrate mutual respect to fellow students and staff
- Performance at selection trials
- Ability to uphold the school's discipline and uniform policy
- Performance in local sporting competitions Selection is completed annually

Being involved in an ACC High Performance class at one specific year level does not guarantee selection in the following year.

Selection is based on the criteria listed above. This process allows developing students who may have missed selection in one year, an opportunity to be involved in the following year.

Students who are not involved in an ACC sport in a current year, but would like to be considered for an ACC team for the following year, must attend ACC Trials as listed above.

Does involvement in an ACC High Performance class guarantee selection into a team?

No. If a student is selected into an ACC High Performance class, then they are part of a specific sporting squad. Selection for all ACC teams will then come from these specific squads.

Students who aren't selected in the final team will be involved in a Physical Education practical class during ACC matches.

What does my son do if he is not in an ACC High Performance Class?

Students not involved in an ACC High Performance Class at

Years' 8 or 9 will be involved in regular Physical Education classes. Students in Year 10 who are not involved in an ACC High Performance class would select another elective.

High Performance Classes are also offered at the Preston campus, however, trials are not required. If you have any questions regarding the trials, please don't hesitate to call Mr Phil Gaut on 9468-3380.

The ladies heard from club President Mike Jolley, who confirmed his intention to stand down from the position at season's




end, and Senior Coach Phil Plunkett who took time out pregame to partake in a Q and A with the capable MC Graeme Clark.




The twins, once VCAL students in the early days of Parade's Preston campus, followed older brother Tim, who completed VCAL at Parade in 2007.

Collection of school information by the Australian Government under the Australian Education Act 2013

Dear Parent/Guardian

Collection of information about schools

The Australian Government provides funding to Australian schools under the *Australian Education Act* 2013. That Act and the associated *Australian Education Regulation 2013* require that your child's school provide the Australian Government with certain information about the school, its financial arrangements, and its student body to ensure the funding is properly calculated and accounted for.

What information is collected by the Australian Government?

The authority that operates your child's school such as, a state or territory education department, a Catholic Education Office, or an independent school authority, will provide basic information about the school to the Australian Government. This includes its name, address, contact details, years of schooling offered and its staff.

The authority must provide the Australian Government with information about the school's finances, including annual audited financial statements and certification that Government funding has been used for proper purposes relating to education.

In addition, the authority will provide certain performance information at an aggregate level, including student attendance rates, student results in the National Assessment Program. For secondary schools this includes, post-school student destinations such as going into the workforce, vocational education and training, or higher education.

The authority is required to publish much of this information, and it is also published by the Australian Curriculum Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) on the My School website at www.myschool.edu.au.

The school authority must also provide information to the Australian Government about the makeup of the school's student body during an annual school census. This is because Australian Government funding varies according to whether students are primary, secondary, receiving distance education, or are overseas students; and is calculated to provide additional funding, called 'loadings', for students at educational disadvantage.

The authority must provide information about the number of students attending the school, including the number of:

- primary and secondary students
- full-time and part-time students
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students
- students with disability
- students with low English proficiency

- students receiving distance education
- boarding students
- overseas students.

Who receives this information?

Most of the information is provided by school authorities to the Australian Government Department of Education (the department). Some of it is provided directly to ACARA.

The department may in turn pass the information on to ACARA, state and territory education departments and authorities, the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS), and the Productivity Commission. The department will also provide the information to other organisations if required or authorised by law to do so.

The department may also disclose the information to its Information and Communication Technology (ICT) service providers, to allow them to provide ICT support services to the department.

Why is this information collected?

The department collects information about schools under the *Australian Education Act 2013* for the purposes of that Act, which include:

calculation of Australian Government funding

oversight of funding conditions and requirements

monitoring of financial performance and educational outcomes of schools

publishing and providing information about schools to the public.

The department also uses the information for research, statistical analysis, and policy development on school education for the Australian Government.

Information passed to ACARA, state and territory education authorities, the ABS, and the Productivity Commission is used by those organisations for their public purposes. For example, the information collected from school authorities under the *Australian Education Act 2013* forms part of the national statistical collection maintained by the ABS.

Is my child identified in the information collected by the Australian Government?

Where school authorities are required to provide the Australian Government with information about students, that information is aggregated statistical data that does not identify individual students. The information is not matched with any other information held by the Australian Government that can be used to identify individual students.

However, from time to time the department engages contractors to audit or verify school records to ensure that the information a school provides to the department is accurate. The information previously collected by the department may also be passed onto these contractors for this purpose.

When carrying out an audit, the contractors may need to access information about individual students from the school's records. This information may be 'personal information' within the meaning given in the *Privacy Act 1988*. The contractors may pass this information onto officers within the department if there is a discrepancy in the data provided by the school and the school's records and further investigation is required.

There may be other circumstances in which a school authority will voluntarily provide information about individual students to the department when seeking additional funding for those students. Most commonly, these are where a student has not been in attendance at a school during the annual school census reference period but the authority wishes to receive funding for him or her, or where the authority believes that the demographics of the students at the school are not representative of the households in the ABS statistical areas serviced by the school.

Other than in exceptional circumstances (for example, investigation of fraud relating to overseas students), the department does not disclose personal information to any overseas recipients.
