### 2019 College laptop allocation for Years 7 and 10 students

Parents will be aware of the College's transition from iPad to laptops for Years 7 and 10 students. In support of students and their families, the College will supply each 2019 Year 7 and Year 10 student with a College laptop device for their individual use at the commencement of 2019.

This fully supported program will allow our students to continue their learning and advancement with an individual laptop device and will conclude our rollout to one to one-laptop devices and finalise our iPad program. The costs of the device will be offset through a subsidised Levy over the three-year period of the device.

Please note the College does not make available fully supported BYOD programs.

More information will be provided to incoming Year 7 parents later in November as part of the enrolment package and to the Year 9 students moving into Year 10 in 2019 in an information package sent out at the end of the year.

#### Daily support for your son's laptop learning device

The College has recently noticed an increase in repairs required to student's College laptop devices.

Parents can support their son's use of this valuable learning device with the following tips and guidelines.

- Laptops should be turned off and placed on charge each evening at the conclusion of homework so that they are fully charged for the next day.
- Laptops should be used on a desk area with good ventilation for school work. Students should not operate their device in a bed or an area of poor ventilation as this can overheat the device and damage it.

- Laptops should be carried in the supplied protective case at all times and not used whilst travelling on public transport or in public spaces.
- The College laptop device is a learning tool and not to be used for games or non-authorised activities.

Other tips and guidelines for laptop use and care are included in the student's planner. If students have any queries regarding their device they can speak with their Tutor Teacher each morning or see the IT service desk at recess and lunchtimes in the Nash Learning Centre.

## 2019 new Learning Management System at Parade College

In 2018 the College reviewed a number of the communication tools it uses, including the College Webpage and our Learning Management System. As a result of this review, parents will note a number of exciting advances in 2019. The College Webpage will be updated to provide clearer communication and easier access to a number of links within the community.

The College is in the process of making a transition across to a new Portal and interactive Learning Management System called Simon Schools. This is an exciting step as it will enable parents to interact directly with the College and their sons teachers via the Portal or the Parent Access Module (PAM).

As Simon is rolled out in 2019, parents will be able to interact and rationalise attendance and learning information, booklists and learning resources, update medical and excursion details and make bookings for events such as Parent Teacher Interviews through the one Portal or App via their phone. Simon will offer students and parents more efficient and consistent access to the College and the day to day interactions in their sons education.

Log in details and support information will be sent out via email and through this *Newsletter* later this year and early in 2019.

## From the Director of Ministry

#### **Prefect Retreat 2018**

How many experiences can one group fit into a day? A group of forty-seven aspiring prefects may well have asked this question on Thursday 30 August as they moved from one inspiring and challenging activity to another.

The day began with a session with Br Damien Price who encouraged the students to be the best version of themselves they can be, as what they have to offer is unique. He also had each student read out the names of an Old Paradian (some from a very long time ago) and of a Year 7 student for 2019, encouraging them to understand the historical and traditional context in which they want to be leaders.

The morning continued with a walk over to the Botanical Gardens where an Aboriginal Heritage Tour deepened our understanding of how the First Australians lived, and of their connection to the land. It also strengthened our resolve to be leaders who wish to work towards Reconciliation.

After lunch at Federation Square we split into two groups for a tour of the National Gallery or a seminar at the Big Issue. Both of these experiences stretched us to see things from different perspectives and to tap into the artistic creativity, generosity and compassion that are essential to good leadership teams.

Mass at St Francis was a good way to say Grace before we dispersed for dinner at Melbourne Central, where Mr Laverack humbly performed ten burpees for being late.

Our day ended at Cinema Nova with the film *Human Flow*, which invited us to dive into our deepest humanity, where we know that all people are equal and are unique and precious in the eyes of God. We witnessed that over 60 million people are displaced from their homes today, the highest number since World War Two.


#### Solidarity Walk 2018

A big thank you to the Parade community who so generously supported our Jubilee Solidarity Walk this year.


The funds are still being counted, but the Prefects are confident that we will reach our target of \$50,000 for the Comboni Sisters' Hospital in Nzara South Sudan.



#### Stella Fella 2018



This year, in Edmund Rice schools all across Australia, Stella Fella Day ran on Friday 31 August. Not only was it an opportunity to don a bowtie for the day, it was a chance to wear a symbol that represents what a good man is and what a good man does.



Stella Fella Day is not about raising money for a cause, but about educating ourselves and raising awareness in our community. It's about sending the message that we stand in solidarity with those who experience discrimination or inequality, with a particular emphasis on the treatment of women who are far more likely to be victims of domestic violence, sexual assault or "image-based violence".

#### Statistics show that:

- one in three women have experienced physical and/ or sexual violence perpetrated by someone known to them:
- on average in Australia, one woman is killed every week by a current or former partner;
- domestic and family violence is the principle cause of homelessness for women and their children; and
- one in three young people aged 16-19 years report an experience of image-based abuse.

These are criminal acts that need to be prevented from occurring in the first place, and it is acknowledged that violence against women starts with the smaller or "low level" types of discrimination towards women.

We at Parade challenge these types of discrimination with Stella Fella.

So what are the more "low level" examples of discrimination and lesser-treatment of women? We ask ourselves:



- At home, do we contribute to the running of our houses in a way that is equal between the genders – are the chores like vacuuming the floors, cooking and hanging out the washing left to the women and girls in our houses, or are they shared by the men who live there too?
- When our mothers, grandmothers, aunties and female teachers speak to us, do we listen and show the same respect to them as we do when our fathers, grandfather, uncles or male teachers speak to us?
- Is our choice of language and the way we speak about women respectful and honouring the dignity that girls and women (just like boys and men) have the right to?

Stella Fella Day is a call to remind us that we must strive to be Stella (or excellent) in our treatment of others, no matter their gender – because all people are worthy of respect and dignity.

And around Stella Fella, may we not just be aware of gender inequality, but a part of a solution.


