classrooms to create a Food Science Kitchen is progressing well and the construction of a Fitness Centre and classrooms at Bunjil Park is nearing completion.



During the Prefect Retreat, which took place on 29 and 30 August, the aspiring Prefect Team for 2020 were involved in a discussion with Mackillop Family Services about the work they do.

Our tour of MacKillop Family Services was an inciteful experience, which aided us in grasping a more thorough understanding of the work that they do. We were invited to listen to four speakers, in small groups, about different aspects of their organisation. Discussions took place about foster families, the need for children (who have been abused or neglected) to know their true stories, the school environments that children experience and the rich significance of the St Vincent Boys' Orphanage that has been transformed into a space for their business operations.

The representatives told us of the lengths that MacKillop Family Services goes to, to ensure the children they care for are adequately supported in all aspects of their lives. Whether it be schooling, home situations, or even supporting them in attending medical appointments.

They display true empathy and advocate for these children and families who are unable to do so for themselves, so that all people can have the same positive experiences that their peers do – truly embodying our annual theme of 'Inclusive Community'.

The experience was significant to me, as I gained a true grasp of the work done at MacKillop, so that I can better understand where our fundraising efforts have gone.

Overall, I can now truly attest to the significance of their services, and can appreciate that our many bake sales, sausage sizzles etc, and our recent Solidarity Walk, are truly helping people.

I encourage all students and families to continue their diligent support of this wonderful organisation for the rest of the year, and going into 2020.

Being privileged enough to be born into a comfortable family and being supported by key adult figures in our community, it is easy for today's youth to overlook and turn away from the somewhat confronting reality of the prevalent issues of family disorientation,

Moving into 2020, I hope to see Parade continue this special relationship with MacKillop Family Services and an increased consciousness towards contemporary issues as we truly strive for an inclusive community.


The prize for first place was four calculators from Casio, the major supporters of the event.



Congratulations to the following students who have been performing well on the sporting field



Long-serving former Parade College staff member, Barb Elliott, who died on 3 September after a long illness, is being remembered as a trailblazer by those with whom she worked at both the old Flowerdale Campus and, more recently, Bundoora.



Year 10 to 12 Dean of Learning Paul Fahey extended heartfelt gratitude to Barb, who was part of the fold at the Preparatory College until its closure in 1988 and later Bundoora for a combined period of almost thirty years.

"Barb was an extremely dedicated teacher and leader of staff. She was really a pioneer as a female leader in a male dominated school, when she took over both as a Year Level Coordinator and Subject Area Leader, and paved the way for the far better balance in leadership that we have today," Paul said.

"She was an extremely hard worker who led by example and put a great emphasis on justice and the student's well-being. An incredibly intelligent person, she also had a really sharp sense of wit and humour as well as being an astute football tipper winning the first ever 'Waterford Brownlow' tipping competition.

"Many of us learnt so much from her and are indebted to her for her caring and nurturing manner as we developed our teaching skills at Parade."

Barb's funeral is to be held at St Francis Church, Mill Park, on Friday 13 September at 10.15am.
