Opening of O'Shannassy Centre

Last week, we celebrated the opening of our latest learning centre, the O'Shannassy Plumbing Centre. Forming an integral part of our Registered Training Organisation, the O'Shannassy Plumbing Centre will provide the opportunity for students to study Certificate III Pre-Apprenticeship and VET training and will greatly assist students who intend on pursuing post-secondary studies either at TAFE, university, apprenticeships, or employment. Made possible through a donation by the O'Shannassy family.

The O'Shannassy family has had connections with Parade College for 90 years. This connection began in 1941 when Brian O'Shannassy attended Parade College at East Melbourne to complete his secondary education. On returning from the war Brian married Gwen and began a family. Their three sons all attended Parade College; Terry and Gary (1966) and Neil (1972). Their daughter, Lynne attended the Academy of Mary Immaculate in Fitzroy. The family association with the College has continued on down through the years with Gary's son, Ben who graduated in 1999.

Brian was always grateful to the Christian Brothers for his education so he enthusiastically became a collector for the Parade Building Appeal which was begun in the 1960s and led to the relocation and building of Parade College Bundoora.

Gwen was an active member of the Parade Ladies Auxiliary both at East Melbourne and Alphington, and then at Bundoora. In recognition of her commitment and service, she became a Life Member of the Ladies Auxiliary in later years.

Dear Parents, Students, Staff and Friends of Parade College,

Following eight years of leadership at Parade College, including the last four and a half years as Principal, Andy Kuppe will conclude his term as Principal of Parade College at the end of the 2022 school year. Andy has been appointed to the new position of Director / Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Edmund Rice Education Australia Victorian Schools Ltd. This is a new position, providing leadership and management to six Edmund Rice schools in Victoria (including Parade College) and we congratulate Andy on this appointment.

We know that this has been a difficult decision for Andy to make, as he has long connections and a commitment to Parade College, however he believes that this is now the right time to take this direction in this exciting opportunity.

Andy's contributions to Parade College during the last four and a half years as Principal have been significant. As the first lay Principal of Parade College in its 150-year history, he has worked with the College Advisory Council and Edmund Rice Education Australia to transition the College from Christian Brothers to lay leadership. He has overseen an increase in enrolments and developed strategic partnerships with La Trobe University, and a range of sporting clubs, including Manchester City Football Club. He has overseen the development of the Master Plan and the subsequent building program at both the Bundoora and Preston Campuses which has already seen the Performing Arts Centre, the Nicholls Pavilion, the Preston Food Science Centre, the redevelopment of the Waterford Sports Precinct, new Science and STEM spaces and the O'Shannassy Plumbing Centre. The final stage of the Master Plan, the Collins Sport Precinct, is currently underway. In addition to this, Andy led the development of the Educational Strategic Plan which introduced a restructure of the College Campuses to allow senior students across the College greater access to senior pathways at the Preston Campus and the commencement of the Manchester City Football School this year. Next year will see improved pastoral care through the introduction of a fifth house, Nolan House. Throughout Andy's principalship, enrolments at the College have continued to grow, leaving the College in a healthy position for the future.

Andy values above anything else the spirituality and faith dimensions of the College and embeds these in the College Mission Statement and Core Values, complementing the desire for every member of the Parade College community to recognise and embrace their God given talents and to use these in the Spirit of Edmund Rice to be the best person they can be so that they can have a positive impact on the world.

Andy will continue his connection with Parade College in his new role. This will include liaising with the Parade College Advisory Council early next year to undertake the process of appointment for a new Principal for Parade College. We expect to attract a high quality Catholic educational leader to take charge of the College with a possible commencement date in January 2024 or earlier.

Mark Aiello has agreed to continue as Acting Principal from January 2023 until the appointment of the new Principal and Mary Dourios has agreed to continue to serve as Acting Deputy Principal. We thank Mark and Mary and the Leadership Team and staff for their commitment to ensure that Paradelbourne students' needs are foremost

VCAA, VCE and VET Unit 3/4 Written Examinations

The first written exam for most students is English on Wednesday 26 October, although some minor language exams also precede the English examination; students involved should carefully check their timetables. Each student should have been issued with the VCAA Exam Navigator which contains all rules and regulations regarding the exam period. An electronic copy is available at:

With formal classes having now concluded, Unit 3 and 4 teachers will still be available for revision in timetabled classes right up until the scheduled subject exam in their usual timetabled classroom.

Upon commencement of the examination period, Unit 3 and 4 students should arrive at the College no less than 30 minutes before the commencement of their exam. Students are to make their way to Westcourt Walk in preparation for the commencement of their examination where seating lists will be displayed. All necessary items for each exam are listed in the VCAA exam navigator. We wish all students the very best in their exams and trust that this final preparation period allows them to enter the examination room for each exam confident and ready to peak.

A reminder to all Psychology and Further Mathematics students who have their exams on 31 October (Melbourne Cup Eve) that there will be no College buses on that day – students must arrange their own travel to and from the College. The VCE Study Centre will be open from 8.00 am and will close at the commencement of the afternoon exam.

Class of 2022 VCAA Results

VCE and VCAL results will be released by VCAA at 7.00am on Monday 12 December. Details on obtaining results are available on the back page of the VCAA Navigator.

Student Wellbeing Support and Careers Counselling

The College will be offering both career counselling and emotional support from Monday 12 to Wednesday 14 December. More information is contained in the letter to VCE students that was included with the graduation certificates at the Valete Evening.

Accelerating Year 11 Students involved in VCAA Exams

Accelerating Year 11 students will continue to attend their timetabled classes until the date of the respective VCAA examinations. If a student has a Year 11 exam on the same day as their VCAA exam, the Year 11 exam will be rescheduled.

Years 8, 9, 10 and 11 Semester 2 Examinations

Semester 2 examinations will be conducted in November; dates and details are provided below. During the examination period, Year 10 and 11 students are not required to attend school other than for scheduled examinations. Correct summer uniform is required. Supervised revision will be arranged for those attending school. Year 8 and 9 students attend as normal.

Examination revision information sessions were conducted in the tutor period last Friday. All students should commence examination revision. Students will receive revision materials to assist in their preparations.

Years 10 and 11 Examinations

Year 10 exams precede a week of Work Experience from 14 to 18 November. Year 11 exams are followed by the compulsory Year 12 Commencement Camp at Phillip Island on 16 to 18 November. Year 11 students are not required at school on Monday 14 November and Tuesday 15 November.

Year 8 and 9 Examinations

If a student is unable to attend an examination, it will not be possible to have the exam rescheduled. Where a student

misses an exam due to approved absence (e.g. illness), then they will receive the grade 'X-Special Circumstance' for that task. Students absent for an exam due to an approved school event (eg; ACC Sport) will be notified of an alternative time to sit the examination that was missed.

Year 8 to 12 2023 Commencement Classes

As the name suggests, all students continuing at Parade in 2023 are required to attend school for 2023 commencement classes. It is important to note that teachers will not reteach this information when school returns in 2023. As such, it is essential that all students attend.

2023 JacPLUS - Jacaranda e-Textbook Bundle for Years 8 to 10 in 2023

In 2023, Parade College will continue to use Jacaranda's \$115 Digital Bundle as its digital textbook and educational resource provider for students in Years 7 to 10.

Parents should have received a letter on 26 September to coincide with the opening of the payment portal.

To ensure that you receive your son's 2023 school year textbooks and resources, you are asked to order and pay the \$115 fee online via Jacaranda's payment portal by 29 October 2022.

Year 10 Edmund Rice Pathways Program (ERPP) students at Preston in 2023 are not required to purchase the Jacaranda Bundle.

Year 7 to 9 ACER Testing

During this term, students in Years 7 to 9 will participate in the ACER Progressive Achievement Tests for Mathematics (PAT-M) and Reading (PAT-R). Your son does not need to study for these tests and the results are not reported.


To reduce disruption, the test date and the lesson that each test will occur in, will be at the discretion of your son's English (PAT-Reading) and Mathematics (PAT-Math) teacher to choose. Your son's subject teacher will oversee the administration of the online test. As tests will be conducted on student laptops, it is important that your son has fully charged his device.

The College believes that the data obtained from ACER PAT testing should not be used in isolation when making judgments about a student's needs or ability but should form part of a broader range of information available about each student to his teachers.


Tutor Teacher and House Leaders are encouraging students to consider moving as this is a historical and significant time for the College as we acknowledge one of the founding brothers through a house named after him

The day was dubbed "Pay It Forward Day" and our College personnel went far and wide across the State to offer their services in a mutually informative and enriching day for all concerned.


