### VCAA Examinations Unit 3 and 4

During this time, Year 12 teachers will still be available right up until the sitting of the subject exam, in their usual allocated times, to assist their students with any “fine tuning” required in their final preparations.

#### Current Year 10 and 11 Students

Current Year 10 and 11 students will receive their provisional subject allocations for 2021 on Friday 6 November. They will also receive their booklists for 2021 subjects and accompanying letter explaining the procedure for online ordering.

Year 11 and 12 (2021) students' subjects are conditional on successful completion of this year's academic program.

#### Current Year 7, 8 and 9 Students

Current Year 7, 8 and 9 students will receive their booklists and subjects on Monday 9 November. The letters accompanying the booklists explain the method of ordering books. All families will be required to place all orders online only via North of the Yarra book supplier.

English novels for Years 8 to 10 (2021) can only be ordered online as a separate order from other purchases. No hardcopy orders will be accepted.

### Year 7 Learning Mentor Trial Program

In 2020 five Year 7 core class groups from both campuses have been involved with the Year 7 Learning Mentor trial program.

As part of the trial, these classes have a second teacher, the Learning Mentor, assigned to their class who collaborates with each class' English and Maths Subject Teachers to deliver an enhanced range of learning activities designed to meet each student's point of need with their learning.

In most cases the Learning Mentor is also their subject teacher for Science, Humanities or Physical Education. As such, each Learning Mentor develops a broader overview of their students' learning in several classes.

With the return of Year 7 students to face-to-face learning, we are looking forward to continuing to explore the merits of trial program and will be continuing the trial in a limited number of classes at Year 7 in 2021.

## From the First Aid Office

### Year 7 School Immunisation Program 2020

Due to the COVID19 restrictions, Banyule Council had advised the Bundoora Year 7 students' immunisation for HPV2 scheduled for Monday, 26 October 2020 to be delivered at Parade College Bundoora Campus was cancelled.

Banyule Council has now notified the College that they will provide this service directly to you external to the College and as such are offering parents and guardians the opportunity to have their son immunised through Council sessions.

### **Banyule Council Year 7 Immunisation Program November 2020**

Banyule City Council will be conducting Year 7 Immunisation Programs to administer the 2<sup>nd</sup> dose of HPV for students. It is important that your child has received their first dose of this vaccine earlier this year (with at least a 6 month interval). If you are unsure if your child has received their 1<sup>st</sup> dose, this information is available through the Australian Immunisation Register.

### Asthma

It is usual for students who have asthma to carry their own reliever medication such as Ventolin in their pockets, however the College is able to supply Ventolin to a student who does not have their asthma medication and spacer on hand.

The administration of Ventolin is done after consulting your son's asthma action plan from PAM. If your son does not have an asthma action plan and the situation is not deemed an emergency, the College will ring the parent/carer to have permission granted to administer the medication.

In the event of an asthma medical emergency and you have not supplied a current action plan, the First Aid Officer would follow emergency asthma care guidelines and an ambulance called.




### Asthma Action Plans

It is important that the College has the latest medical information for your son. Unfortunately, there are a number of parents and carers who have not supplied a current asthma action plan to their son's medical profile.

Parents/carers of students with asthma are requested that they check their son's medical profile and ensure that they have supplied a current asthma action plan signed by a Doctor to the College and have uploaded this plan to their son's medical profile on PAM.

Pitching their action plan via Zoom, students were given valuable feedback on the best approach to go about their ambitious goals.

Aiming high with plans for fundraising for a small-scale industrial composting system, these students see their journey as one of many stages before achieving that final goal.

These stages involve generating a greater awareness of how waste is managed at the College and the necessity of reducing and redirecting the waste that now goes into landfill or finds its way into the environment.

They envisage pilot programs to trial new ways of dealing with that waste and better ways of treating compostable waste so that it will benefit the sustainability and biodiversity programs already happening at the College.

Seeing their journey as one that involves the whole Parade community these students are keen to engage other students, parents and the Parade College network in their vision and welcome assistance, feedback and support.

### 2021 ACC High Performance Sport Classes – Years' 8 to 10

The subject selection process for choosing High Performance is closed. Listed below are some questions and responses that may assist in the understanding how ACC High Performance is conducted at the College.

#### How does a student get into an ACC High Performance Class?

When selecting subjects for 2021, students who wish to play either football or soccer must select ACC High Performance – Semester 1 as part of their subject selection. Students wishing to play either, Basketball, Table Tennis, Hockey, Cricket Tennis or Volleyball must select ACC High Performance Semester 2 as part of their subject selection. If a student wishes to play a sport in Semester 1 and 2 then they must selection ACC High Performance – Semesters' 1 and 2.

Please Note – Whilst a student may select to do ACC High Performance Sport, this does not guarantee them a position in the class. The number of students wishing to be involved in the subject is far greater than the number of positions available and as a consequence, students are selected into the subject based on a combination of some or all of the following criteria;

- Previous ACC involvement and performance
- Involvement and performance in regular Physical Education classes

- General behaviour and ability to demonstrate mutual respect to fellow students and staff
- Performance at selection trials (indication of intention to tryout – Forms survey filled out)
- Ability to uphold the school's discipline and uniform policy
- Performance in local sporting competitions Selection is completed annually
- For 2021 selections – further information via the Forms survey

Being involved in an ACC High Performance class at one specific year level does not guarantee selection in the following year. Selection is based on the criteria listed above. This process allows developing students who may have missed selection in one year, an opportunity to be involved in the following year.

Students who are not involved in an ACC sport in a current year, but would like to be considered for an ACC team for the following year, must attend ACC Trials as listed above.

#### Does involvement in an ACC High Performance class guarantee selection into a team?

No. If a student is selected into an ACC High Performance class, then they are part of a specific sporting squad. Selection for all ACC teams will then come from these specific squads. Students who aren't selected in the final team will be involved in a Physical Education practical class during ACC matches.

#### What does my son do if he is not in an ACC High Performance Class?

Students not involved in an ACC High Performance Class at Years' 8 or 9 will be involved in regular Physical Education classes. Students in Year 10 who are not involved in an

ACC High Performance class would select another elective. High Performance Classes are also offered at the Preston campus; however, trials are not required.

Students can also make a late application to VTAC however the costs are significantly higher.

### Tax File Number

Year 12 students are reminded that they cannot enrol in a CSP (Commonwealth Supported Place) university course next year without a Tax File Number (TFN).

Students who do not have one are reminded to apply for a TFN online and have their identity verified through an interview at a participating Australia Post office.

### USI

A USI - Unique Student Identifier - is a reference number that creates an online record of your training and qualifications attained in Australia.

Current Year 12 students are reminded that you will need a USI number when applying for Commonwealth financial assistance when you enrol at university next year.

Students who have already been studying a VET subject may already have a USI and it is recommended that they create or find their USI via [www.usi.gov.au](http://www.usi.gov.au) ahead of time.

### ADF - Australian Defence Force Cyber Gap Program

The Australian Defence Force Cyber Gap Program is for you if:

- You are an Australian citizen
- You want to be a cyber-warrior or be on the front line in cyberspace
- You are studying cyber at University or TAFE in 2021
- You would like assistance, mentoring, Defence work experience and have your study course fees paid!

At the end of your studies, there's no obligation to join ADF, although they certainly hope that you will. But if you chose not to join, they help you prepare for other jobs.

An additional test date - 8 December at 8.00pm - is becoming available for January Round 1 Offers. The results from both of the November and December tests will be expedited to VTAC for processing in time for January Round 1 consideration.


### **A Tip from the Parade College Careers Team....**



## From The Old Paradians

### Cotchin In A League Of His Own

When Trent Cotchin joined Senior Coach Damien Hardwick in hoisting the silverware in the euphoric aftermath of Richmond's 2017 AFL Grand Final triumph on the MCG, he became the first Old Paradian to captain a Premiership team.




Two years later on the hallowed turf, Trent bettered that statistic in becoming the first Old Paradian to twice captain a Grand Final-winning outfit.

Then on Saturday night at the Gabba, Trent not only completed the captaincy threeppeat, but made further history in becoming the only OP in 123 years of competition to feature in three Grand Final victories.

A student through four years at Parade before crossing to Penleigh and Essendon Grammar School, Trent completed his schooling at the Bundoora campus in 2005 when the accompanying College photograph was taken. That year he was part of Parade's Year 10A Premiership team – a team which included future League footballers Daniel Currie and Patrick Veszpremi, and the Old Paradians Amateur Football Club captain Chris Kandilakis.

Trent represented Parade in football for the first time in Year 7, 2002, under the watch of his then coach the late Paul Crowe.



In the ensuing years 2003-'5, he chased the leather for the College under the tutelage of Rob Peckham, a self-confessed Richmond tragic.

"Trent was always destined not just to be an AFL footballer but to be a leader. When he first spent time at Punt Road in Year 10 I joked with him how great it would be to one day see him run our for my Tiges," Rob said in a previous interview.

"He was always an exceptional talent, but he was always working to improve himself too. In year 9 he committed himself to a pre-season with West Preston, one of the top teams in the Northern Football League, and not long after he got a placement with Richmond."

Since the formation of the VFL in 1897, 17 Old Paradians are known to have represented their respective clubs in a total of 30 Premierships at senior level. It is also a matter of record that at least one Old Paradian has featured in a VFL/ AFL Grand Final triumph in each decade (with the exception of the 1890s and 1980s) since the League competition's inception in 1897.

Curiously, 'Jock' McHale lined up in a back pocket as playing coach of Collingwood's victorious Grand Final team of 1917, but the Magpies centreman Percy Wilson tossed the coin as the designated captain in that match.

McHale (1912-'13) and Alphonsus 'Phonse' Kyne (1942 and 1946-'49) both captained Collingwood, but not in Premiership years - as did Harold 'Lal' McLennan and Sergio Silvagni, the captains of Fitzroy in 1911 and Carlton in 1964 respectively.

Trent is one of three Richmond Premiership players to have been schooled at the College after Bob Carew and 'Paddy' Guinane, who died last December. A 251-game, three-time Jack Dyer Medallist as Richmond's best and fairest player, Trent was of course adjudged the Brownlow Medallist for the competition's fairest and best in 2012, with Peter Bedford (1964) Parade's only other Medallist having earned the award representing South Melbourne fifty years ago this year.

In the College's storied history, a total of ten Old Paradians now follow Trent as dual VFL/AFL Premiership players. The 17 known VFL/AFL Premiership players (ex-Parade) from 1897-2020 inclusive are as follows;

## **'Wheels' Lace-Out To Pratt On Nash's Watch**



Pictured here in his South Melbourne strip, handballing the Sherrin to the legendary South full-forward Bob Pratt and the equally legendary Laurie Nash alongside by the pickets is Parade's very own Peter Bedford (1964), the League's Brownlow Medallist of 50 years ago.

Peter, who was recently inducted to the Old Paradians' Association Hall of Fame, and whose name graces the newly-built sporting facility at Parade College's Bundoora Campus, recently recalled this moment at the old Lakeside Oval - home to him through his 178-game in nine seasons - five of them club best and fairest seasons - for the mighty Bloods.

"This was a press photograph and I reckon it was taken in the early 70s," Peter said recently.

"The thought behind those who organised the photo was to get the two great legends back to the Lake Oval where they forged such great histories . . . and I was fortunate enough to be part of it."

Harold Robert ('Bob') Pratt represented South in 158 games (including the 1933 Grand Final triumph) from 1930-'39 and beyond the war in '46. In '34 he famously booted 150 goals in a season - a record equalled by Hawthorn's Peter Hudson in 1971, but never broken.

Laurence John ('Laurie') Nash was a member of South's 1933 premiership team, its captain in '37 and leading



goalkicker in that year and again in '45. As with Peter, Laurie also excelled in cricket, as a paceman and hard-hitting lower order batsman who represented Australia in two Tests.

Though Bob and Laurie chased the leather well before Peter's time, the latter holds fond memories of the pair of them – particularly Laurie who together with another former South great Ron Clegg were positive influences on Peter when he first joined the club from nearby Port Melbourne.

And it was Laurie with whom Peter would often share a convivial ale at the nearby Cricket Club Hotel (mine host the late Brian 'The Whale' Roberts) on Clarendon Street. "It was a great meeting place for sportsmen of all sorts, from 'Nashy' through to Sid Patterson the great bike rider and 'Soapy' Vallenge the great Carlton full-forward," Peter said.

"The famous story with 'Nashy' of course was that when they asked him who was the best footballer he'd ever seen he'd reply 'I see him every morning when I shave'."

Peter recalled a funny aside to this photograph, which related to when it was first presented as a framed auction item at a South Melbourne Football Club function in the city.

"A particular person came up to me, not obviously having a great knowledge of history, to ask me who the two old timekeepers in the photo were. I had to tell him that those two old timekeepers were two of our greatest players," Peter said.



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
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## To The Memory Of Ron Bennett
