Br Regis Hughes followed later, arriving on the SS Montrose on 17 April 1870.

This is endowed by Edmund Rice Education Australia and is presented to the senior student who has made an exemplary contribution to the advancement of a particular aspect of College life.

Years 8 and 9 Semester 2 Examinations

Semester 2 examinations for Year 8 and 9 students commenced this week, dates and details are provided below. The correct summer uniform is required. Year 8 and 9 students attend school as normal.

Year 9 Exams:	15 November to 17 November
Year 8 Exams:	14 November to 17 November

If a student was unable to attend an examination, it will not be possible to have the exam rescheduled. Students who miss examinations due to approved absence (eg; illness), will receive the grade 'X-Special Circumstance' for these tasks.

Years 8 to 12 2023 Commencement Classes

As the name suggests, all students continuing at Parade in 2023 are required to attend school for 2023 commencement classes. These classes will commence on Monday 21 November. It is essential that all students attend.

Commencement timetables will be visible on SIMON for students by this Saturday. In constructing the timetable, our

priority is always to maximise students' elective choices and to balance class numbers. Other than for compelling cases, no further changes will be possible.

Subject Allocations and Booklist Orders for the 2023 Academic Year

Current Year 7 to 11 students have received their provisional subject allocations for 2023. They also received their booklists for 2023 subjects and an accompanying letter explaining the procedure for online ordering.

Places in Year 11 and 12 2023 subjects are conditional on successful completion of the 2022 academic program. Contact will be made with families of students previously advised with subjects under review over the coming week.

Parents should take careful note of the submission dates for booklist orders. VCE orders have now closed and delivery is scheduled for this week in time for commencement classes. Orders for Year 8 to 10 2023 English novels close on Wednesday 23 November for delivery this school year. All other Year 8 to 10 orders close on 6 December for delivery in late January. Home delivery is the only option available for the distribution of all books.

Year 8 Camp

We are looking forward to the Year 8 Camps beginning the week of Monday 21 November and would like to take the opportunity to share with you some advance information about the Year 8 Camp.

The camp will be held at PGL Campaspe Downs. Further information regarding activities and facilities will be made available through respective House Leaders. Parents, Guardians and Carers have had access to permission forms on PAM from Monday 7 November.

We ask that all families complete the permission for the Camp on PAM by Wednesday 16 November to give permission for your son to attend. Camp is a compulsory activity in the academic year.

Please ensure your son's medical profile is up to date on PAM including any dietary requirements so that we can pass this on to the camp. If your son requires medication while on camp, please complete the Medication Permission form on PAM and bring it on the morning of camp. Students who require EpiPens or Asthma inhalers will need to ensure they bring them on camp.

If you are unsure how to use PAM, or if you experience difficulty in setting up your account, please email <u>pamsupport@parade.vic.edu.au</u> and request one of our IT Technician's assistance in doing this. If you do not have access to a computer, please contact your son's Tutor Teacher and arrangements will be made for a hard copy of the documents to be provided.

Frank Brennan is a Jesuit priest and Rector of Newman College at the University of Melbourne. He is a Distinguished Fellow of the PM Glynn Institute at Australian Catholic University, an Adjunct Professor at the Thomas More Law School at ACU and research professor at the Australian Centre for Christianity and Culture. He chaired the National Human Rights Consultation for the Rudd Government and was a member of the Turnbull Government's expert panel which conducted the Religious Freedom Review. The Morrison Government appointed him to the Voice Co-Design Senior Advisory Group to help guide the Co-Design process to develop options for an Indigenous voice to government. Frank serves on the boards of Jesuit Social Services and the Na-

tional Apology Foundation for Indigenous Australians and on the Advisory Council of the Global Foundation. His research interests include conscience and faith, human rights and the rule of law, and the rights of Indigenous peoples and asylum seekers.


Clearing Lockers

Bundoora Campus Immunisation Catch Up From Banyule Council

Over the past two years of Covid Lockdowns, school closures and sickness have reduced the capacity for adolescents to access the HPV and Meningococcal ACWY Vaccine.

In relation to this, the Department of Health has requested local councils to develop and implement 'catch up sessions' for students that have not completed or have missed out on being able to have these vaccines.

Additional sessions are being conducted in December at the below venues to allow students this opportunity of having their initial dose or completing the scheduled requirement of two doses.

Banyule Council has asked the College to communicate to all the families of all year levels to help them advocate and provide awareness of the vaccine availability and ensure that your sons are provided the protection they require.


Hay Fever


