From the Principal

The College's 150th Anniversary was launched by the Archbishop of Melbourne, Peter A Comensoli, when he presided at Eucharist for the whole staff last Friday. It was a significant moment, as it was 150 years to the day that the first Bishop of Melbourne, James Goold opened Parade College with Eucharist on 29 January, 1871. We presented the Archbishop with a copy of our prized painting of Mater Amabilis (Mother Most Loving) that I described in the last *Newsletter*.



We launched also our 150 logo. Each staff and student will be presented with the logo on a badge. On the first day for students our College Captain, Adam Crick, and our Vice-Captains, Jacob Beattie and Luca Franco, volunteered to raise the College's 150 flag. A similar ceremony was held at Preston with Year 12 Prefects Dino Koutes, Max Mason and Laurence Nardella.

The annual musical is well into preparation and the cast is being finalised. Given the COVID circumstances, we are unable to stage a musical in our traditional arrangement with Mercy College. Targeted sessions focussing on VCE English, Literature, Apprenticeships and Sport Academy pathways allowed students the opportunity to be immersed in their chosen study and pathway while the Elevate Education sessions provided a platform for study skills and time management.

The Wellbeing sessions run in House/Campus groups reinforced the students' connectedness to the Parade College community. The valuable contribution that these wellbeing programs make to nurturing the Parade spirit that celebrates its 150th year in 2021 was at the forefront of these sessions. The day concluded with addresses by Mr Kuppe and Ms Pyle challenging the boys to enjoy the year and to make the most of the opportunities that present.

From the Dean of Learning Years 7-9

Year 7 ACER Testing

From Monday 15 to Thursday 18 February all Year 7 students will be participating in ACER Progressive Achievement (PAT) and Abstract Reasoning tests.

The PAT Mathematics and PAT Reading tests will be conducted during one of your son's English and Mathematics classes during this period while the Abstract Reasoning test will occur during one of your son's Religion classes.

All tests will be conducted on your son's school laptop. These tests are designed to provide information to teachers about your son's skills and understandings in a range of key areas and as such students **do not** need to study for these tests.

Each test will take approximately forty minutes to complete with students able to use a blank piece of paper for any working out.

Before the test date your son will receive an email to his school email account informing him of his ACER username and password.

Your son's classroom teacher will provide him with specific instructions for each test on the day. If your son is absent on the day, he will sit the test upon his return to school.

Year 7 Learning Mentors – Continuation of Trial Program

During 2021, at Year 7, the College will be continuing its trial of the involvement of a second qualified classroom teacher, the Learning Mentor.

Five Year 7 core class groups across both campuses will be involved in the trial for 2021 either for the entire year or for a semester. For those classes, the same Learning Mentor will work alongside that classes English and Maths Subject teachers.

The role of the Learning Mentor will be to work with the English and Maths Subject Teachers with the aim of delivering a range of learning activities that will better meet each student's learning needs in each of these two subjects. The Learning Mentor will also work closely with the Maths and English Subject Teachers, Tutor Teacher and House Leader in providing pastoral care for your son.

As always, your son's Tutor Teacher and House Leaders are the first ports of call for all issues and concerns a parent may have about their son.

From the First Aid Office

Please ensure student medical information is entered online via the parent portal to assist us in providing the most appropriate care.

First Aid staff cannot dispense over the counter medications (for example, paracetamol and antihistamines) unless parents request a medication permission form from First Aid, sign it and supply the medication in its original packaging.

Please let the College know immediately if your son develops chicken pox/varicella, shingles or measles. Other students may be receiving medical treatment which increases the risk of complications from these infectious illnesses.

Students sometimes suffer from illness or injury during the school day. Parents will be contacted when necessary and may be asked to collect students from school. We do not have the capacity to care for students throughout the day when they are not fit to participate in their usual school activities.

Exceptions to this include students who are undergoing rehabilitation and transitioning back to school after absence, and students managing chronic illnesses.

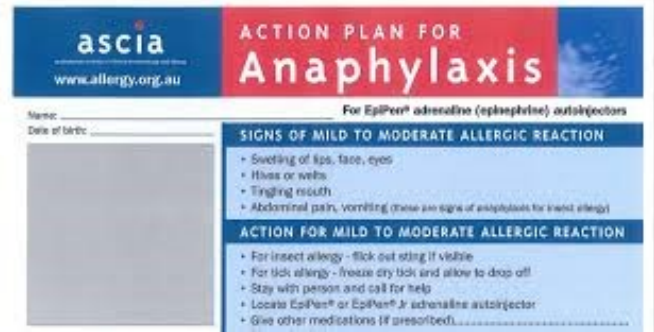
Parents, please keep your contact phone numbers up to date, including at least a third contact person for times when you are unavailable

Anaphylaxis

Management plans are prepared for students with serious allergies who may be at risk of anaphylaxis.

An Anaphylaxis kit containing an ASCIA Anaphylaxis Action Plan signed by your doctor, and an adrenalin auto injector (such as EpiPen) must be at school for your son's use in an emergency.

Students must take their "home" kit to all off-campus and out of school hour's activities.

Individual Anaphylaxis Management Plans have been forwarded to parents, please sign and return to Reception as soon as possible

Asthma

It is usual for students who have asthma to carry their own reliever medication such as Ventolin in their pockets, however the College is able to supply Ventolin to a student who does not have their asthma medication and spacer on hand. The administration of Ventolin is done after consulting your son's asthma action plan from PAM.

If your son does not have an asthma action plan and the situation is not deemed an emergency, the College will ring the parent/carer to have permission granted to administer the medication. In the event of an asthma medical emergency and you have not supplied a current action plan, the First Aid Officer would follow emergency asthma care guidelines and an ambulance called.

Asthma Action Plans

It is important that the College has the latest medical information for your son.

Unfortunately, there are a number of parents and carers who have not supplied a current Asthma Action Plan to their son's medical profile.

Parents/carers of students with asthma are requested that they check their son's medical profile and ensure that they have supplied a current asthma action plan signed by a Doctor to the College and have uploaded this plan to their son's medical profile on PAM. This will allow our first aid officers the ability to act quickly with the appropriate guidance to assist your son.

The allowance will be paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The annual CSEF amount per student will be \$225 for secondary school students.

Garvey Terrace

Garvey Terrace II

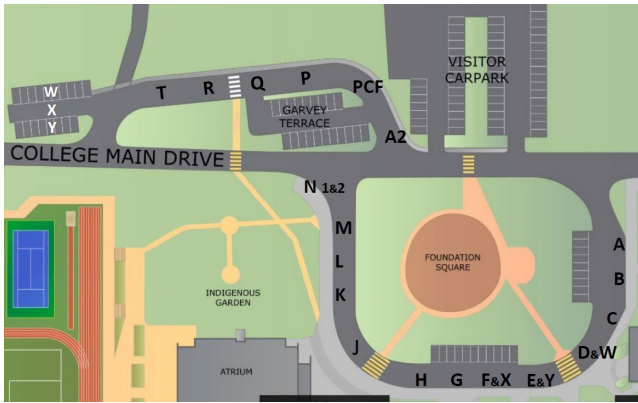
- Vehicles entering the main driveway from Plenty Road may park in the Garvey Terrace II and Garvey Oval carparks.

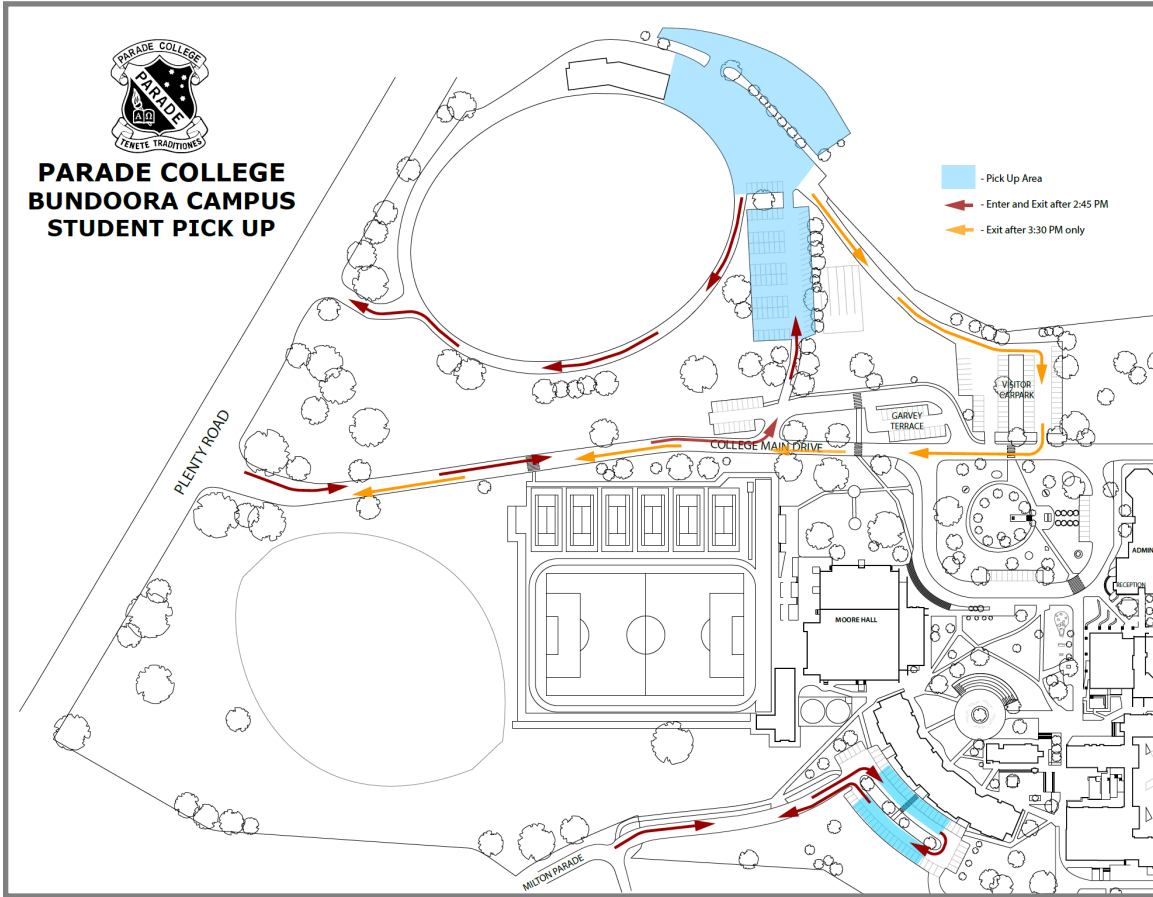

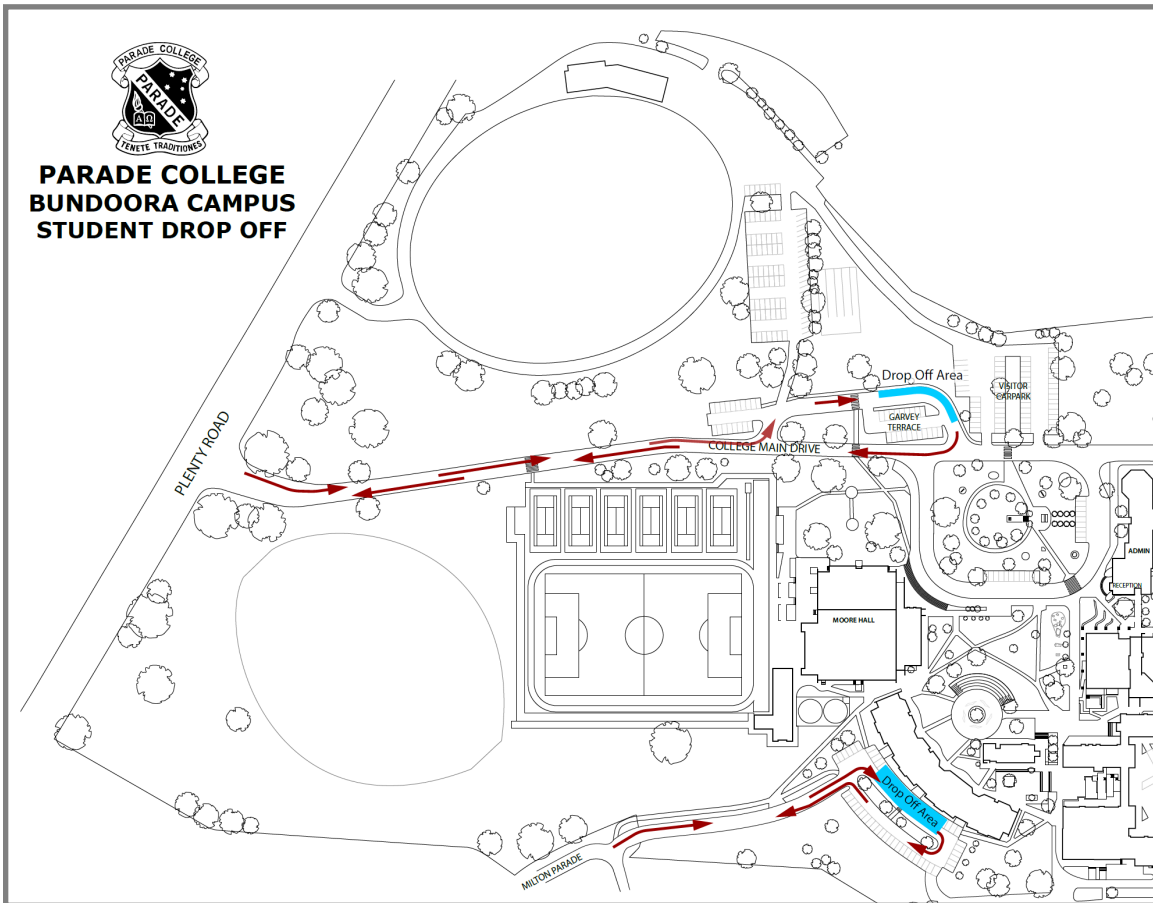

Old Paradian Earns OAM

Patrick Street, an Old Paradian who served for almost 20 years as a Victorian Magistrate, has been recognised for his achievements in the Australia Day 2021 Honours List.

Patrick, who completed his Intermediate year in 1958, was awarded a Medal (OAM) of the Order of Australia in the General Division for service to the law and to the community.

A Clerk of Courts from the time he left the 'Old Bluestone Pile' through to 1981, Patrick later served as Magistrate from 1981 through to 1999; and as Deputy Chief Magistrate for a five-year period from 1995.

A former Secretary and Member of the Victorian Magistrates' Association, Patrick's love for the law saw him contribute as its Journal Editor (1983-1986) and as Editor of the Magistrates' Information Bulletin (1995-1999).

He also founded Monthly 'Letters of the Law' Cryptic Crossword; was co-author of The Health Act Victoria, Law Book Co, 1983; and established MagistratesCases.com.au (mid-2000s) – a website resource with access to over 2500

specialised case reports in electronic format.

Patrick also served as President of the Australian Crossword Club; and Editor and Publisher of CrOZworld magazine.

Patrick effectively pursued his legal career from the outset after gaining passes at Parade in English Expression, English Literature, Latin, French, General Science A and General Science B.

In a previous interview for newlayerlanguage.com, Patrick talked about studying law part-time at Melbourne University whilst a Clerk of Courts - and it's history now that he graduated from Melbourne with an LLB in 1976 and a Diploma in Criminology in 1980 and in 1976 was admitted to practise as a Barrister and Solicitor of the Supreme Court of Victoria.

As he said: "I wanted to get onto the bench as a Magistrate".

"I didn't particularly want to leave the job and become a solicitor or a lawyer, I wanted to get on the bench," Patrick said. "I've been in the courts a lot being a clerk of courts, so it meant I was facing the lawyers and barristers, and I did the same thing when I was on the bench, I faced the lawyers. So I've never been in Court where I've faced the Magistrate. I can't really say if I would have enjoyed being a lawyer, because I've never done it."
