From the Principal

Our 2022 College Theme

Each year the College has a theme for inspiration, challenge and guidance. Over the past few years they have been:

2018: Parade College – *Justice and Solidarity*

2019: Parade College – *Inclusive Community*

2020: Parade College – *Gospel Spirituality*

2021: Parade College – *150 Years of Liberating Education*

This year we embrace 2022: Parade College – *A Spirited Tomorrow*

There are a number of reasons for adopting this theme. Firstly, after celebrating 150 years in 2021, we naturally look towards the next 150 years, our *tomorrow*. After a formal review last year, we look to name and implement a new strategic plan.

We are liturgically in the Year of Luke. St Luke, the writer of a Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles, has more to say about the Spirit than any other biblical writer does. Luke portrays the Spirit as the activity and presence of God (Luke 4:18), but also as a force or power (Luke 5:17, Luke 8:46), and, for example, as “the Spirit of Jesus” (Acts 16:7). In turn, for Luke, Jesus was a man primarily of the Spirit.

And in becoming and being guided as followers of Jesus, experience of the Spirit was more important than texts, traditions, or the community. Not surprisingly then, the key turning points in Luke’s two-volume story are initiated by the Spirit, particularly Jesus’ birth (Luke 1:35), baptism

(Luke 3:21-22), temptation (Luke 4:1-2), and the start of his ministry of speaking and healing (Luke 4:18).

The beginning of Acts (Acts 2:4) and the story of the beginning of the mission to the Gentiles (Acts 10:44-48) are also marked by experience of the Spirit. The Pentecost story, the high point of what Luke says about the Spirit, is the fulfillment of the promise of God for the followers of Jesus (Luke 24:49). Until this point, apart from Jesus (Luke 3:22, Luke 4:1), very few people are filled with the Spirit. However, Luke emphasizes that the Spirit appeared to all the disciples (Acts 2:1-4) and that the story was a model for us as later Christians (Acts 2:38).

In a secular sense, ‘spirited’ means fully of energy and enthusiasm, focused, determined, generous, kind.

What better theme than to have *A Spirited Tomorrow*

Ventilation System

Students and Staff have noticed vents in more and more of the College's classrooms, both on the roof and in the ceiling. Over the break, and during this term, part of the College's response to COVID is the installation of ventilation. The fresh air systems installed at Parade College not only provide a safe learning environment for pupils and teachers in our current climate, but offer a sustainable and optimal learning environment post Covid-19.



These systems bring 10l/s of fresh air per student within the classroom from the outside environment, as per 'The World Health Organisation' guidelines. The air is filtered and dispersed through a grille located next to the A/C unit. This allows the unit to recycle fresh air and not Co2 from the classroom environment.



The increase in volume means that the classrooms air quality is rejuvenated over the length of the teaching period. Once the students and teachers vacate the classroom the process continues for 30 minutes to ensure the breathable air quality is of a high standard for the incoming class. The automated functionality of the system provides seamless operation that requires minimal input from staff due to the sensory system.

Air Purifiers

The Victorian Government has rolled out air purifiers to all government and low-fee non-government schools to remove potentially infectious particles – like coronavirus – from higher-risk areas



in schools including staff rooms, sick bays, music rooms and other high traffic areas. Parade College has received almost 100 of the devices and is rolling them out to areas yet to have fresh air ventilation installed. The purifiers have been delivered by tech giant Samsung.

ACC Sport

The first term ACC sports commenced last week for senior students with fixtures in Cricket, Tennis, and Volleyball, and we wish the teams a successful season. Meanwhile, students from all age groups are preparing for the ACC Athletics Carnival on Thursday 24 February, and for the ACC Swimming Competition being held on Wednesday 30 March at MSAC.

Launch of Manchester City Football School

Last week classes began for the two Year 7 groups in the Manchester City Football School Program. We are delighted to have Jonathan Sant from Manchester City here with us as we await the appointment of the ongoing coach in the next few weeks. The participating boys were delighted to receive their uniforms and get out on the pitch for the specialised drills.



Celebration 150 Concert

Because of COVID restrictions, the 150 Celebration Concert scheduled for Hamer Hall on 21 February will now be filmed and unveiled at a cinema in second term. Whilst regrettable that we cannot have a live performance, I am delighted that we can still celebrate the College's Performing Arts talents.

College Open Day

Our annual Open Day takes place on Sunday 13 February at both campuses and we welcome families wishing to learn more about the educational opportunities offered by the College.

to Parade College over 43 years, including development of the Edmund Rice Pathways Program (ERPP) for Year 10 students, and the widely regarded innovative VCAL Program at Preston Campus. Currently John is enjoying leave and looking forward to what the new year brings.

Parking

As Parade College Preston Campus and Sacred Heart Primary School are both located on Clifton Grove, the road is often very busy, but particularly so at pick up times.

There are staggered finish times between the two schools which assists with the flow of traffic, however the road can be congested when drivers illegally double park to wait in the middle of the road for their student to get into the car.

This is extremely unsafe, and Darebin Council Parking Officers patrol school zones each day to monitor parking.

There is a supervising teacher on the front gate until 3.35pm. Parents can arrange a pick up time or place with their son, as students can wait inside the gate under shade on the seating for their parent to arrive.

Any student crossing the road is to use the crossing located on Clifton Grove.

On Tuesdays and Wednesdays Homework Club is open until 4.30pm and students can exit via the gate to Reception.

An alternative collection point is Irene Street, which students can access via the rear gate of the Campus.

Parents driving to collect Parade students are requested to be mindful of the traffic and for us to all to work together in providing safety for students, including speaking with the boys about using the roads safely by following road rules.

We look forward to working with you in partnership throughout the year, and we encourage families to be in contact with your son's Tutor Teacher if you would like to chat regarding a concern or query.

Preparing for a Success in Learning

It was wonderful to welcome all our new students to Parade last week, together with all returning students. Both campuses were buzzing with enthusiasm and positive energy.

Given the disruptions of the past year, some students may find it challenging to re-establish a routine regarding their learning and being back in the classroom.

Families should be aware that your son's teachers have developed classroom agreements with their students and involved them in a discussion about student learning responsibilities and expectations.

As part of this discussion, the importance of boys taking an active part in their learning was reviewed along with expectations such as:

- Being punctual and prepared for all classes.
- Viewing 'Lesson Plans' on SIMON for lesson details and related resources.
- Check SIMON daily for:
 - ◆ Due dates
 - ◆ Task related resources
 - ◆ Rubrics and feedback
 - ◆ Calendar events
 - ◆ Learning Centre resources.
- Use of the student planner to record homework and assessment due dates.
- Submit all tasks by the due date.
- Contact your teacher before the due date regarding clarification, assistance and any concerns regarding your ability to submit a task on time.
- Take an active part in your learning. What does it look like to be active in the classroom?
- No distractions (eg; headphones, no phones, etc.).
- Pursue excellence. Have high expectations of yourself and of your teachers.
- Take on board feedback. Reflect on this feedback. Ask questions.

- What can you do if you are confused?
 - ◆ Look at the board and check the information that you have received
 - ◆ Quietly ask the person next to you
 - ◆ Ask your teacher for assistance
 - ◆ Email your teacher or organise to see them at recess or lunch.

MS Teams

We were all very grateful to have MS Teams at our disposal over the past two years. These class accounts have again been set up for this year, in readiness for any potential school closure. We pray that this will not be necessary.

All Lesson Plans will be placed on SIMON for students and parents to access. Lessons are not accessible via MS Teams while onsite and face-to-face classes continue.

Learning is able to continue for students who are required to isolate and unable to attend school by monitoring SIMON Lesson Plans.

Feedback from the student body suggests that the day was informative, valuable and enjoyable and a great way to start the academic year.

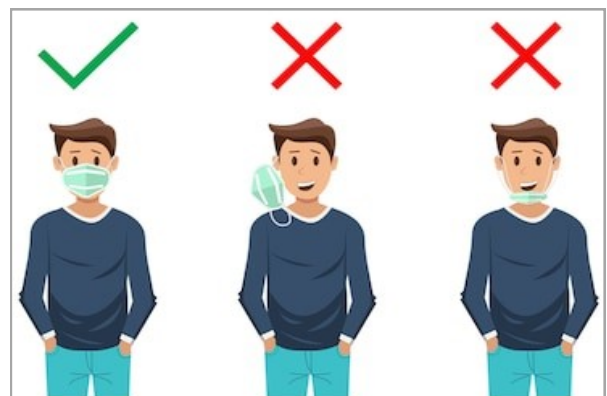
VCE Parent Information Evening 2022

From the Dean of Learning Years 7 to 9

ExCEL ELP 1 resumed Wednesday, 9 February . A reminder that students should wear their PE uniform and check their timetable for classes, as some room changes have occurred.

As many classes will be resuming excursions shortly, parents are reminded to look for excursion permissions in PAM over the coming weeks.

Year 7 ACER Testing

During the period of Monday 14 to Thursday 17 February all Year 7 students will be participating in ACER Progressive Achievement tests (PAT). The PAT Mathematics and PAT Reading tests will be conducted during one of your son's English and Mathematics classes on your son's school laptop.

These tests are designed to provide information to teachers about your son's skills and understandings in a range of key areas and as such students do not need to study for these tests.

Each test will take approximately 40 minutes to complete. Before the test date your son will receive an email to his school email account informing him of his ACER username and password.

Your son's classroom teacher will provide him with specific instructions for each test on the day. If your son is absent on the day, he will sit the test upon his return to school.

Student Absence from an Assessment - Years 7 to 10

Where a student in Years 7 to 10 is absent for an assessment as a result of an approved reason (eg; illness, medical reason, self-isolation) students and their families should be in contact with their son's teachers to negotiate a revised date to submit the task. Generally, this is upon return to school, or may be up to seven days after a student's return. The revised due date will appear on SIMON/PAM.

Where a teacher is of the opinion that it is unreasonable for a student to sit an assessment due to approved absence, then the grade '*X-Special Circumstance*' may be used.

Where a student is absent due to an unapproved reason (eg; holiday, etc.) then he will receive an '*NS – not submitted*' (Years 7 to 10) or '*NA – Not assessed*' (VCE Units 1 to 4).

Parents will also be notified of the non-submission via a letter on PAM indicating the new date by which the student will need to submit the task.

For Years 8 to 10, the original grade of 'NS' or 'NA' remains as the student grade even upon satisfactory submission.

In Year 7, upon successful resubmission, students may receive a grade to a maximum of a 'C'.

An afterschool '*Academic Redeemer*' session may be issued by your son's House Leader or Student Welfare Coordinator in situations where he has not submitted a task even after being provided with a new resubmission date. Where this is the case, parents will receive communication from their son's House Leader or Student Welfare Coordinator.

Parents should also be aware of the grade bands used at Parade for Years 7 to 11 for summative assessment.

VCE Units 1 to 4

If a student is absent for a VCE assessment, it can only be rescheduled upon presentation of a medical certificate covering the time of the assessment.

More details are available in the VCE Handbook available to all students and parents on SIMON/PAM.

Edmund Rice Pathways / VCAL

In the event of any approved absence (eg; illness, medical reason, self-isolation) families and students are encouraged to notify their subject teacher of the absence and negotiate a revised date to submit any outstanding tasks; the new submission dates will be reflected on SIMON/PAM.

For other situations such as facing difficulty with managing work placements, or where there are extenuating circumstances, a student will seek advice from the teacher prior to the due date as how to best address any difficulties.

If the assessment task is not submitted by the due date without a valid reason, an afterschool 'Academic Redeemer' session may be issued by your son's Coordinator.

Not submitting assessment task will result in an 'NS' for that piece of work.

Prior to the end of semester report, teachers will assess as to whether a student is likely to satisfactorily pass the subject and will notify parents if this is not the case.

Should it be necessary, other arrangements may be made for the student to meet the requirements.

Parent Portal – Medical Information

It is important that the College has the latest medical information for your son. Please take the time to review your son's medical information and update when required. All students will have an alert via PAM to validate medical information for 2022 with any current updates, enquiries to pamsupport@parade.vic.edu.au

Year 7 Immunisations - Boostrix and HPV1 – 23 February

Parents of Year 7 students are reminded that your son's immunisation consent card is due back to your son's Tutor Teacher on or before 13 February. If you do not wish for your son to be immunised at school the consent card still needs to be returned to the College with 'no' ticked.

Anaphylaxis - Epipens and Excursions

Parents of students that are at risk of Anaphylaxis should be aware that, in response to Ministerial Order 706, it is College policy and a requirement of legislation that students who attend the College must have supplied the College with a valid Epipen and a current Anaphylaxis Action Plan for their personal use.

In order for a student to attend an excursion or event off the premises they must carry their individual College Epipen and their spare Epipen from home with them in order to attend that event. This is to ensure that sufficient medications are available should the student require them.

Parents/carers are required to update their son's expired Epipen and Anaphylaxis Action Plan as soon as possible. Epipens and Action Plans need to be dropped at College Reception at both campuses.

If parents have specific enquiries about Epipens please contact Ms Ireland in First Aid at our Bundoora Campus.

Asthma

It is advised for students who have asthma to carry their own reliever medication such as Ventolin in their pockets, however the College is able to supply Ventolin to a student who does not have their asthma medication and spacer on hand.

The administration of Ventolin is done after consulting your son's Asthma Action Plan from PAM. If your son does not have an asthma action plan and the situation is not deemed an emergency, the College will ring the parent/carer to have permission granted to administer the medication.

In the event of an asthma medical emergency and you have not supplied a current action plan, the First Aid Officer would follow emergency asthma care guidelines and an ambulance called.

Asthma Action Plans

It is important that the College has the latest medical information for your son. Unfortunately, there are a number of parents and carers who have not supplied a current Asthma Action Plan to their son's medical profile.

Parents/carers of students with Asthma are required to check their son's medical profile and ensure that they have supplied a current Asthma Action Plan signed by a Doctor to the College and have uploaded this plan to their son's medical profile on PAM.

You can also email the Asthma Action Plan as an attachment to cathie.ireland@parade.vic.edu.au

Action and management plans for all significant health issues allow our First Aid Officers the ability to act quickly with the appropriate guidance to assist your son.

Students with other significant health issues are requested that their management plans for their condition are dropped off at Reception, which will be forwarded to the First Aid Officer.

Literature and Altior English teachers will communicate their expectations directly with their classes.

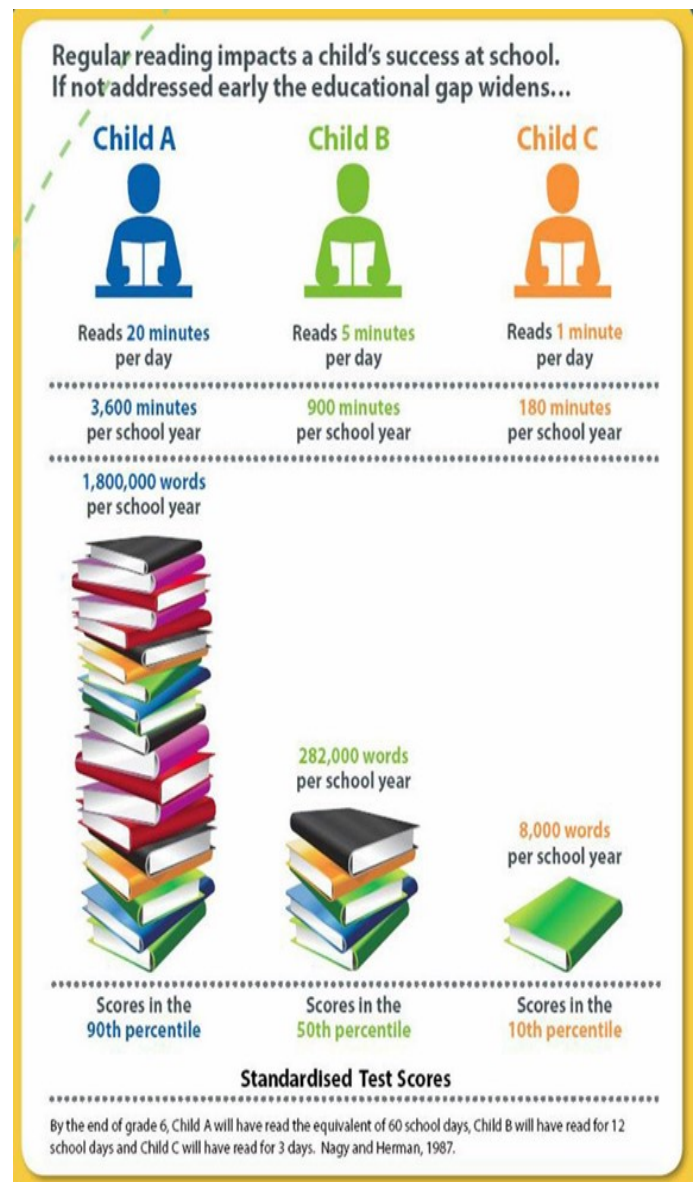
Wider reading

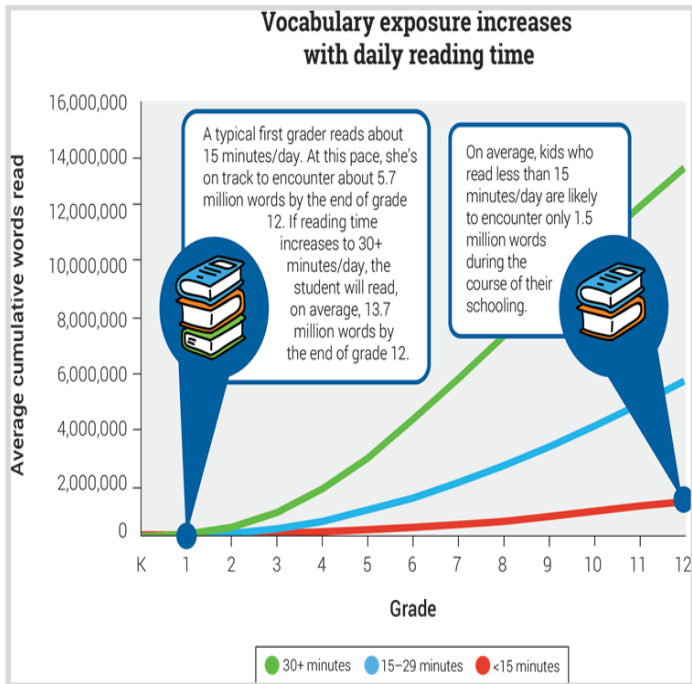
The above books are a part of the formal English curriculum. Students are encouraged to engage in wider reading – that is,

reading beyond these books – which will enable them to become better readers, better thinkers, and, ultimately, better people.

Students should read for at least twenty minutes each afternoon/night.

Research conducted by Fisher, Frey and Hattie (2016) confirms that knowledge of vocabulary directly correlates to higher levels of achievement. In the below graphics, you can see how important reading is to your son's vocabulary development.





- Talk to your son about what you are reading. It is key to show your son that you enjoy reading and think that learning is important. In turn, ask your son about what he is reading and studying in English. To assist with this, you may like to read the book your son is studying in class, so that you can more deeply engage him in conversations about it.
- Visit the library together and borrow books for yourself as well as for your son.
- Scatter books, magazines, newspapers, and comics in everyday places — the car, bedroom, or the breakfast table.
- View websites together with your son, share e-Books, even listen to audiobooks. This all counts as reading — every little bit helps!
- Have conversations with your son about current events and happenings in your community.

Additionally, a key finding in the recently published literature review '[The impact of reading for pleasure and empowerment](#)' is that reading for enjoyment not only boosts educational outcomes, but also enhances their emotional understanding.

Reading increases empathy, enriches social relationships, reduces symptoms of depression and instils an overall sense of wellbeing.

Parade encourages reading by running the Parade Reading Challenge, the Word Millionaire and participating in the Premiers' Reading Challenge. Students can earn House points, certificates and badges for participation.

What you can do to help at home?

The Harvard Graduate School of Education offers the following advice for parents trying to develop their son's reading skills:

- Read in front of your son. We know that all children learn from what they observe. If you're visibly engaged in and excited about reading, your son is likely to catch your enthusiasm and become a better reader himself.

150. Past. Present. Parade. Update

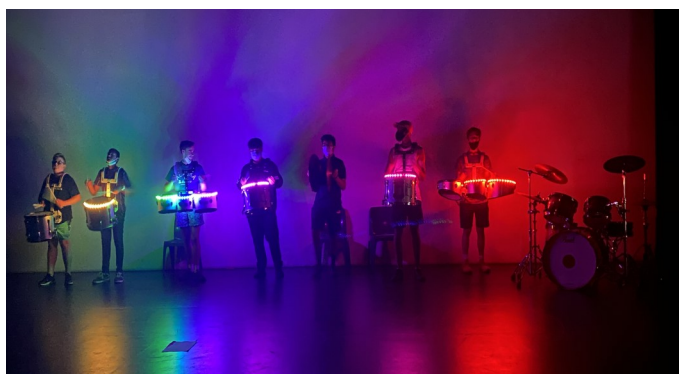

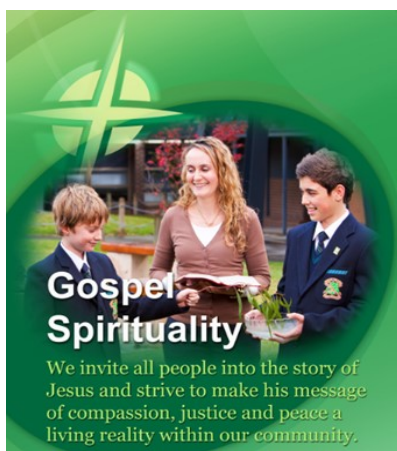
