



From the Principal

Our Open Day took place last Sunday on both campuses as we welcomed many families wishing to learn more about the educational opportunities offered by the College. Many thanks to the Parade staff, parents, and students who helped in so many different ways on the day. The visitors were extremely impressed and commented most favourably on the students' friendly greetings and willingness to share experiences.

The Old Paradians Annual Bike Ride from Alphington terminated at the College as part of Open Day. It was good to see present students and parents joining Old Paradians' for the ride.

This week the second group of Year 12 Tenete Groups embark on their overnight Ministry Retreat. All Year 12 students are expected to attend one of these retreats. The Annual Musical is well into rehearsals and the cast and crew are working very hard across both Parade College and our partner, Mercy College. This year's musical is *Footloose*.



But the miracle was not just in the asking, but in the giving! The generosity of the early people of Australia that had little, but gave so generously.

That Spirit still lives today. I will be nothing as Principal of Parade College, no matter how innovative, brave, hard working, etc, without the generosity, kindness and support of those that came before me or those that work with, for and alongside me today. I need each of you, members of the Parade community, and your generosity, your patience, your kindness, and when I make a mistake – your forgiveness, otherwise I am sure to fail.

A WORLD OF OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUNG MEN

Dear Parents and Members of the Parade Community,

I write to advise that a former staff member of Parade College in the 1980s, Br Rex Elmer, last week pleaded guilty in the County Court to two counts of unlawfully and indecently assaulting children at St Vincent's Orphanage in the 1970s. Br Rex Elmer was the Administrator of the Alphington Campus from 1982 to 1985. Parade College respects the legal process underway and its role in providing justice to those who have experienced abuse as children. These matters in relation to Br Rex Elmer remain before the courts, as such the College refrains from commenting further on them.

What I do want to say to our Community today is that Parade College is a safe place for all our students and we have in place all the necessary policies and procedures to ensure the protection of all our children.

It goes without saying that the College abhors the abuse of children, whose social, emotional and spiritual wellbeing is central to our purpose and mission. That any child was abused – no matter how long ago – is a tragedy. Parade College continues to stand in solidarity with those that have experienced abuse as children.

I believe it is worthwhile to remind the Parade College Community that our College, Edmund Rice Education Australia (EREA) and the Oceania Province of the Christian Brothers have a number of established mechanisms in place to report any concerns of child abuse and/or can make further contact:

Dear Members of the St Kevin's College Community

I write to you today in my capacity as Executive Director of Edmund Rice Education Australia (EREA), the governing body of St Kevin's College, to advise you of key leadership changes at the College.

Mr Stephen Russell has resigned from his role as Headmaster of St Kevin's, effective immediately. It is important that we acknowledge the selfless contribution that Stephen has made and his commitment to St Kevin's College and EREA over many years. We wish Stephen, his wife Kate and their family well as they move on to a new phase of their lives.

I am announcing the immediate appointment of Mr John Crowley, currently Principal of St Patrick's College Ballarat, as the Acting Headmaster of St Kevin's College for 2020.

John is a very experienced Principal and acknowledged leader in Catholic education. He has extensive experience in educating boys and places a very high emphasis on the academic, wellbeing and spiritual development of students. He is very highly regarded in the educational and broader community for his leadership.

John is also well known as a trusted advocate for victims and survivors of abuse and was a significant contributor to the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse. John has our full confidence and will be strongly supported in his work of both responding to the challenges that have recently been raised for the College and ensuring that the academic, wellbeing and spiritual care of the students remain a priority.

Luke Travers has been formally stood down from the College pending further investigations of issues raised during the Four Corners program.

Two teachers who are currently under EREA investigation, are also not presently at the school until further notice, until those investigations are complete. I urge you to understand that details of any investigation, including the identities of those involved, must remain private to ensure natural justice occurs.

EREA accepts the gravity of the matters raised in recent days. Business as usual is not an option for St Kevin's in response to these issues, which need to be addressed as a matter of priority. It is clear that what has occurred has fallen short of what the community expects, and what we expect of ourselves.

No student should ever have to go through what Paris Street did and no family should either. We are so sorry and we let you down. Importantly, it must be stated that we find the crimes of Peter Kehoe abhorrent and we strongly condemn all behaviour of this nature. Further to this, we wish to acknowledge the suffering and distress caused to Paris Street and his family, as a result of Kehoe's crimes. I have reached out to Paris and his family to offer our ongoing support.

They made a plea for an education that empowers them to challenge what is dehumanising and wrong. As educators, we hear these voices and commit further to this empowerment of the young through the education we provide them. For most members of the St Kevin's community, watching the program was a distressing and challenging experience. However, what was not heard, were the voices of the thousands of hard-working people in the St Kevin's community – parents, staff, past parents and Old Collegians – who strive to create a positive culture and opportunities for a deeply committed student body, each and every day.

As a national family, we express our support for you, at a time when your community is experiencing pain and distress. This is a time for humility and reflection, but also action.

As the governing body we will be initiating an independent cultural review of St Kevin's to further understand current issues, and importantly, how we can take action to address them. We will keep our community updated regarding the cultural review.

Please know that the safety and wellbeing of students and young people is at the centre of all we do. We have an unshakable commitment to embracing the recommendations of the Royal Commission and to the support of all victims and survivors of abuse. We have very clear expectations of all our schools in relation to the paramount importance of child safety.

We have confidence in and are deeply committed to a vibrant and caring St Kevin's College community; its hard-working parents, committed staff and dedicated students. EREA will continue to work closely with the College community to ensure that your boys will have the highest quality of care, safety and wellbeing.

Our hearts might feel heavy but our spirit is not. It marks a fresh, new era for St Kevin's College as we get back to focusing on what really matters – care for our students, our purpose and core values.

The courage of Paris Street and Ned O'Brien should bring us closer together, not divide us. We must do better and we will – together as one St Kevin's College family.

May we work together during this time of challenge with renewed confidence and resolve to form young men who will forge a more respectful and compassionate Australia.

The academic year started very well in Treacy House. 2020 is a very special year for me because the current Year 12 boys started at Parade when I became Treacy Upper House Leader.


It was wonderful to see these fine young men assisting our new Paradians!

Community Action Report

Year 10 Community Action Program

This week the first group of Year 10 students commence their Community Action Program placements.

Students have been learning about Volunteerism in their Religion Education classes in preparation for their five-week placement. Most students will be volunteering in residential aged care working with a range of elderly residents. Some students will be working at social support day groups with the elderly. Other students will be doing valuable work at the 'Boots For All' sports program and the Bundoora Men's Shed.

The Community Action Program has allowed so many of our young men to engage with elderly residents and build positive intergenerational relationships that help to develop greater understanding and empathy.

I wish the students well for their placement and their RE teachers and I look forward to visiting them at their agency.

Bundoora Retirement Village- This Is Your Life Project

Eight Year 10 students are completing a special placement at Bundoora Retirement Village. The project allows the residents to engage with our young people in a meaningful way and facilitates a sharing of knowledge and experiences.

Students have paired up with a resident and are spending Thursday afternoons getting to know their life story. Students will then document the life story in written or digital form.
