

From the Principal

Last week we celebrated Ash Wednesday to mark the beginning of the Church season of Lent. Lent is a 40 day time of preparation for the joyful celebration of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ at Easter. A prayer service was held in each Tutor Group with the



focus on the symbol of the ashes and the call to take stock of our lives and relationships during this time.

During Lent we raise awareness of the plight of the neediest people in our world and offer some support through MacKillop Family Services' partnership with Parade College.

The College has introduced a voluntary item into the uniform: College Beanie. The Beanie can be part of the winter uniform and can only be worn during Terms 2 and 3: to and from school; recess or lunch; and at other times at teachers' discretion, eg sport, some excursions, etc. No other beanies are permitted to be worn as part of the uniform. The Beanie will be available for purchase through our uniform supplier Academy Uniforms. They will be available by April 20th in store at Thomastown, online, and at both Preston and Bundoora campus shops. The price is \$25 (which includes a \$5 charity donation to MacKillop Family Services).

Our Year 7 students are this week attending camp in House groups for three days and all seems to be going well. Each House group is also participating in the Treacy Trail, an No. 4 4 March 2020

excursion designed to help students understand more of the history and traditions of the College. Thanks to the organisers and the staff who are accompanying each group.

On Monday, the Music staff hosted the ACC Jazz Ensemble Workshops. It was a wonderful musical experience for our students and a great opportunity to host students from other schools. The Father-Son Summer Games Night takes place on Monday 16 March.

Last week the ACC Swimming Competition took place at MSAC in South Melbourne. Congratulations to the coaches and swimmers on winning sixth place in the aggregate competition with some great individual performances. At these championships a Parade College student set a new ACC record: congratulations to Jayden Carr (Year 12 H05). Details can be found in the High Performance Sports Report on page 15 of this *Newsletter*. We look forward now to the ACC Athletics Competition on Wednesday 25 March.

This week we were to welcome the visiting staff and students from our sister school in Takada in Japan for the annual homestay and cultural exchange. Term One Mid-Semester Reports and Student Progress Interviews Years 7 to 12

Mid-Semester reports will be released online via PAM on Wednesday 18 March at 10.00am.

Parents of Year 9 students should note that Year 9 ExCEL reports for Extended Learning Project 1 are not included with the interim report. The ExCEL report will be released online at 10.00am on Friday 27 March.

Student Progress Interviews are scheduled in the coming weeks. There are two opportunities for these important learning conferences to occur, in the final week of Term One and the first week of Term Two.

Thursday 26 March 3.45pm to 5.45pm and 6.30pm to 8.30pm

Wednesday 15 April 3.45pm to 5.45pm and 6.30pm to 8.30pm

Interviews at Bundoora campus will be in Alphington Court, while those at the Preston campus will be in the Mackillop Centre.

Parents and students are encouraged to attend. It is far more beneficial that students attend with their parents. On the interim reports available on PAM, teachers may have indicated that an interview is required. Parents may also initiate the interview by booking appointments to meet with their sons' teachers. Teachers will be mindful to keep interviews to the times designated.

Please bring along your son's printed interview times, as they include the location of each teacher.

Bookings for Student Progress Interviews will be available via PAM at 10.00am on Wednesday 18 March, coinciding with the release of the mid-semester reports

Communication of NonSubmission, Resubmission and Risk of Non-Satisfactory Completion.

The continuous reporting capability of SIMON and the associated access to this information on Parent Access Module (PAM) enables students and parents to obtain timely feedback about students' progress in each subject.

PAM also enables parents to more effectively monitor the submission status of their son's work and their results for submitted tasks. When students do not submit work (NB. an extension may be granted), or if a student is required to resubmit work that was initially assessed as below a C grade, teachers will generate a letter accessible by parents on PAM.

Details for all assessment tasks, including due dates, can be accessed in each of your son's subjects under 'Learning Areas'.

Letters generated by teachers are the main method of communication by teachers to notify parents of tasks that were not submitted or were below an acceptable standard. Of course, teachers will still communicate other concerns relating to your son via email or phone.

As always, we encourage parents to contact their son's subject teacher to discuss how we can work together to support your son's progress.

Year 9 and 10 Semester Elective Changes

At the commencement of Semester Two, students in Years 9 and 10 will begin their second semester electives resulting in a new timetable for each student in those years.

Though core subjects continue into Semester Two, because of the implementation of a new timetable, some students may find that one or more of their current Semester One teachers for the subjects of English, Science, Mathematics, Humanities or Religion may also change.

Though we try to limit the impact a new timetable has on these classes, it is not always possible for students in Years 9 and 10 to remain with the same teacher for the whole year.





First Aid Service

Parents would be aware that the College runs a First Aid Centre in support of the community during the school day.

Our First Aid trained staff are permitted to provide your son with medications as directed by a Medical Practitioner as part of a registered plan, such as Ventolin or an EpiPen.

> Staff are not permitted to distribute medications such as paracetamol and anti-inflammatory medications.

Parents will be contacted to pick up their sons from the school if such medications are requested.

Any student who presents to First Aid with any head or neck contact must be picked up by parents as per the College's procedure.

EpiPen's and Excursions

Parents of students that are at risk of anaphylaxis should be aware that, in response to Ministerial Order 706, it is College policy and a requirement of legislation, that students who attend the College must have supplied the College with a valid EpiPen and a current anaphylaxis action plan for their personal use.

Student becomes the Teacher

Over the past three weeks, the Year 12 Sports Academy boys have been completing a literacy assessment. The assessment met the VCAL outcomes relating to writing and oracy for practical purposes. The assessment consisted of two students pairing up, acting as a client's personal trainer, and training them for three 50-minute sessions in the new Peter Bedford Centre.

The clients were some of our Parade College staff with their focus being on functional strength training and cardio. These sessions included an introductory chat, pre-testing and post testing to see if the clients had improved on their previous results. The seven clients chosen for this assessment were Mr Harris, Mr Shelton, Mr Turner, Mr O'Kearney, Mr Seymour, Mr Fermanov and Mr Rajendran.



The Sports Academy boys successfully ran all three of these sessions and all staff made some big improvements in regards to their pre-test results and goals. Overall, it was easy to see by these improvements that the boys took a serious interest in their clients and worked well to help improve the fitness of these staff.

We would like to thank the seven staff that participated in this assessment and for taking time out of their busy schedules to help us with our VCAL literacy outcomes.







ACC Swimming Championships 2020

Last Thursday night the Parade Swimming Team competed in the ACC Swimming Championships.

The Division 1 competition at any ACC Carnival is a hotly contested event and the boys who represented the College were outstanding. In 2019, we finished in 6th place and we were looking to better that in 2020.

At the conclusion of the carnival we finished in 4th place overall and were joint winners of the Under 13 pennant.

This overall team result is a credit to all the boys who swam and to all the boys who attended as members of the squad.

A highlight of the evening was watching our Swimming Captain Jayden Carr (Year 12 H05), pictured below, break the ACC Senior 50m Butterfly record. This is his second ACC record over the past two years.

"I Am Truly Humbled" - Andy Kuppe's Historic Assembly Address

Old Paradian Andy Kuppe (1983) was today formally commissioned as Parade's new Principal.

Andy's commission - together with that of the newlyappointed Deputy Principal and fellow Old Paradian Mark Aiello (1990) - took place in Moore Hall at the Bundoora Campus before more than 1900 students, teachers and staff who had gathered for Term 1 Assembly:



In an historic moment, Andy took the pledge in the presence of his mother Ursula and brother Mick, and his predecessor as Principal Dr Denis Moore cfc - Parade's last Christian Brother to serve in that capacity in almost 150 years. Dr Paul Shannon - Director of Learning representing Edmund Rice Education Australia and President of the Old Paradians' Association - was then called upon to commission Andy as Principal.

By George! Beeden's contribution to College Song

For years the College song has been belted out by countless thousands of students both past and present – and yet few if any would know of its origins.



Thankfully, the story behind the story of the song's genesis has been well-documented – from as far back as 1961 when *The Paradian's* unnamed correspondent recorded the passing of one of the tune's lyricists – to more recently in 1994 when the ode's roots were examined in greater detail by the current Principal Andy Kuppe, then *The Paradian* editor.

Broadly speaking, the College song can be sourced to the pre-World War II year of 1937, when three men committed their collective talents to the formation of the song - Br Bernard Murphy, Br Harry Parker and Old Paradian George Beeden.

shoulders with fellow Parade prefects Michael McInerney and the captain of that year, Terry Moran.

In a section headlined PREFECTS, 1966, the following is reported;

Anthony Aulsebrook: Tony, a Paradian for twelve years and now a second year Matriculation student hoping to study medicine at Melbourne University, is the eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. E.F. Aulsebrook, Heidelberg. Vice-Captain of Treacy, and Secretary of Our Lady's Sodality, he is also a committee member of the Chess Club. Tony's varied interests include golf, table-tennis, basketball, dancing, billiards and sound recording.

Anthony later returned to Parade in a teaching capacity, mentoring Form 3 students and later committing his energies as coach of the Under 14s a school football team, together with the under 14s, 15s and 16s basketball teams, amongst the first of Parade's round ball players.

Anthony's teaching career took him beyond Parade's gates and as his lifelong friend and fellow former Parade teacher Michael Kennedy reveals in the following tribute – presented him with a myriad of opportunities through a life well-lived.
