

# Human Papillomavirus (HPV) Vaccine Information for Parents/Guardians

From 6 February 2023, the routine two dose HPV vaccine schedule provided to young people aged 12 and 13 years through the National Immunisation Program (NIP) has become a single dose schedule using the same Gardasil®9 vaccine.

#### What is the HPV vaccine?

The Gardasil®9 vaccine protects against HPV infection, which is a common viral infection, usually affecting the genitals and spread through sexual contact. The vaccine is most effective when given before exposure to the virus, that is before a person becomes sexually active. #### How has the HPV vaccine schedule changed?

From 6 February 2023, the recommended HPV vaccine schedule for most people has changed from two-doses to a single dose course using the same Gardasil®9 vaccine. There is no change to the amount of vaccine that is given in the single dose.

The schedule has not changed for immunocompromised people. A three-dose schedule of HPV vaccine is recommended for people with severely immunocompromising conditions, regardless of their age when they started vaccination.

#### Why was this change made?

The change is based on advice from the Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation (ATAGI), who have considered and reviewed the latest international clinical evidence. ATAGI support the large volume of clinical findings that a single dose of HPV vaccine provides about the same protection as two doses of HPV vaccine.

#### What do you need to do?

Your Council Immunisation Service will seek your consent for vaccinations delivered to students at school as usual.

The College recognises that literacy is foundational to all learning, and it empowers students to communicate effectively, succeed academically, and engage successfully in society.

Our keynote speaker for the day is Kirstin Bourne, an educational consultant who will work with teachers to build upon our current understanding of teaching methodology and the science of reading to support literacy in students.

# Term 1 Mid-Semester Reports and Student Progress Interviews

On Wednesday 29 March at 4.00pm, Mid-Semester Reports will be released for parents on PAM, and the Parent Teacher Interview Booking System opens for bookings for parents/ carers and students to meet with teaching staff. Mid-Semester reports will feature teacher judgments related to a range of learning behaviours. Results for completed assessment tasks may be accessed on PAM. There will be two opportunities for Student Progress Interviews, both in the final week of Term 1.

10.00am to 12.00pm, and 1.00pm to 3.00pm

On the Mid-Semester Reports available on PAM, teachers may indicate that an interview is required. Parents and carers may also initiate the interview via PAM by booking appointments to meet with their son's teachers.

When booking interviews for those conducted at school on 4 April, as interview times are six minutes each in length, parents and carers are asked, where possible, to avoid booking interviews back-to-back to each other to allow for movement between interview sessions.

Teachers will be mindful to keep interviews to the times designated.

Please note that Thursday 6 April is a student-free day so remote interviews can take place. When booking appointments, parents and carers will need to login into PAM to access the MS Teams link that is provided for each interview session.

Below is a list of things you can do at home to ensure your son in prepared for NAPLAN:

- Talk to him about the tests and encourage him to do his best
- Look at the NAPLAN public demonstration site together to see what kinds of questions will appear on the tests <a href="https://www.nap.edu.au/naplan/public-demonstration-site">https://www.nap.edu.au/naplan/public-demonstration-site</a>
- Ensure your son restarts his laptop every few days, to ensure his software is up to date.
- Ensure your son charges his laptop at home the night before each testing day, and then check that he has packed his charger in his laptop bag to bring to school.
- Ensure your son packs his headphones on each of the testing days. AirPods or Bluetooth headphones are acceptable, but wired headphones are preferable if you have some.

#### Wellbeing Barometer - Dr Michael Carr-Gregg

Last year proved to be yet another challenging year. The ongoing impact of the pandemic, the continuing war in Ukraine, humanitarian crises, the rising cost of living, unprecedented flooding and growing social polarisation and the ever-present threat of climate change, have impacted and overwhelmed many families who are trying to recover, rebuild and adjust to a new kind of "normal".

Throughout such difficult times, it is important that parents and caregivers continue to build relationships, foster connections, enable understanding and break down barriers as they navigate a pathway toward better mental health and wellbeing for young people.

Therefore, we are seeking your participation in a short survey. It is intended to act as a barometer to help gauge the state of student wellbeing within the community. The information gathered will enable us to focus on some of the key issues

and highlight where further assistance may be required.

With mental health concerns on the rise, it is evident that many young people may need some extra support and parents and caregivers play a vital role in enabling a child's ability to thrive.

#### **Learning Centres Update**

#### **Reading Matters at Parade**

The Year 7 and 8 English Reading Program has kicked off with all classes visiting a Learning Centre. These library sessions provide students the opportunity to develop reading skills with targeted activities in literacy and oracy. Students also get time to borrow with the support of their English teacher and a Teacher Librarian. Teacher Librarians check students' reading habits, working directly with students to provide feedback on progress, as well as offering advice on genres and new books.

All students involved in the Reading Program take part in the Parade Reading Challenge with "Book Bingo". "Book Bingo" sets students the challenge of completing a bingo sheet of different reading choices. Students earn get house points and an exclusive "Reading Matters" badge. The top readers in each house will earn another badge at the end of the year.

Students who read a minimum of five age-appropriate books are invited to participate in Word Millionaires, a reading comprehension program and challenge where students tally their words read.

Within only a few weeks of Term 1, we already have two students who have reached one million words each! Word Millionaires receive a "Star Reader" badge, House points and may earn further prizes at the end of the year.

The final date for "Word Millionaire" and "Book Bingo" is Friday 27 October 2023. At the end of the year, the top reader is awarded a trophy. Medals and certificates may be won as well.


Reading matters at Parade, and we encourage reading as a daily practice for our students at home. Research has shown that concentrated reading for at least twenty-minutes regularly is the amount of time needed to start seeing improvement in reading ability.

There are a few things parents can do to support reading at home, and the Harvard Graduate School of Education offers some advice:

- Read in front of, or with your child. Children learn from what they observe, and when parents are engaged in and excited about reading, their child is likely to catch your enthusiasm and become a better reader themselves.
- Talk to your child about what you are reading, and in turn, ask your child about what they are reading and studying in English. You may like to read the book your child is studying in class so that you can more deeply engage them in conversations about it.
- Visit your local library together and borrow books for yourself as well as for your child. Alternatively, browse the Parade College Learning Centre Homepage (accessible via SIMON) for access to thousands of eBooks, digital magazines, comics, graphic novels, Audiobooks and more.
- Keep reading material in everyday places, and close at hand.

#### What if I missed ordering before Photo Day?

You can still place your order online OR you can call us on (03) 9428 9420 and our friendly staff can help you complete your order over the phone. We recommend that all orders are placed before photo day to ensure your child's order is included in the bulk delivery to the school.

#### What if my child is wearing a face mask?

Covid-19 is still a very real concern for a lot of people and National Photography are conscious of ensuring that everyone feels safe while having their photos taken. Subjects may wear their mask up until the photo is being taken at which point, we will request that they remove their face mask. If the subject does not wish to remove their face mask at any point, the photographer will not enforce this and will take their photograph with their face mask on.

#### Why does my child have to take their glasses off for photos?

Due to the aspects of studio lighting, we will sometimes get light reflecting in a subject's glasses. Our Photographers work hard to ensure reflections are not visible in the image but this isn't always possible. Where reflections are visible these will be removed in post-production. To assist our post-production team, it is helpful to have a photo of the subject without their glasses. The photographer will explain this to any affected subjects on the day and request that they remove their glasses for a photo.

If the subject is uncomfortable removing their glasses they will not be forced to.

#### Do the photographer's notice if my child's hair is out of place?

We have mirrors and combs on hand for all students to access before their photo time. Photographer's are trained to pick up on things such as hair falling in front of eyes an depending on the school's photo requirements we will advise student's on how to present for the photo. We are advised by the client of certain requirement's for their students ahead of photo day that can include hair, piercings and uniform requirements. We are very respectful when speaking with students and will never force them to do anything that makes them feel uncomfortable.

There is a time commitment around meetings but the capacity that is developed by the students to be involved in real time decision making, assessing proposals put to them and being able to work as a team to come to a consensus in their decision making is invaluable.
