ANZAC Day

Yesterday we commemorated ANZAC Day. We remember that Old Paradians fought and died in each major campaign and many Old Paradians are serving in Australia's armed forces today.

We remember in a particular way those who served in the 1st and 2nd World Wars and the Vietnam Wars in the Honour Boards in the Hickey Foyer. The chief architect of the first ANZAC Day solemn service was an Anglican priest, Canon David John Garland, who pictured an "All Souls' Day for Australia" in 1916, to commemorate the losses suffered at Gallipoli.



His wish was for the service to be acceptable to all faiths and denominations or it would not be observed. I think observing ANZAC Day provides an opportunity for all of us to reflect on life its meaning and its tragedies.

ANZAC Day, whilst in many ways a secular ceremony, has spiritual components that resonate for us as a Catholic school in the Edmund Rice tradition - be it in the sacrifice, in the lowering of the flag, the bugle call, the minute's silence - something's calling us and as people of faith, we would believe that's God calls to us in these sacred moments.

Lest We Forget


Edmund Rice Day - Sunday 5 May

Mothers and Carers are invited to attend this year's Mothers Day Breakfast with their son's on Tuesday 14 May in the Frank Mount Rooms.



School TV - A Special Report: Mobile Phone Separation Anxiety

The use of mobile phones and technology in schools has been a highly debated topic internationally, including in Australia. Almost all states and territories in Australia, have implemented full bans on mobile phones during class, recess, and lunch times while allowing students to carry their phones during travel to and from school.

At Parade College, phones are to be turned off and placed in student lockers and bags between 8.35am to 3.15pm. If phones are used in classrooms or break times during the school day they can be confiscated and stored at Student Reception.

Critics argue that there is no evidence supporting the effectiveness of such bans, but this is a mischaracterisation. Studies have shown the positive impacts of mobile phone bans in schools.

One study conducted in 2016, found that banning mobile phones led to an increase in student performance, with test scores improving by 6.4% of a standard deviation. Similar studies from Spain and Norway also supported these findings.

For parents concerned about mobile phone separation anxiety in their children, it is important to acknowledge it as a real issue and discuss the negative effects of phone addiction, such as sleep problems and mental health issues. Gradually introducing phone - free periods at home, setting clear expectations and boundaries, and modelling healthy behaviours can help your child cope.

It is also crucial to establish a support network and seek professional help if needed. Implementing mobile phone bans in schools allows for better focus on teaching and learning, minimising distractions and interruptions.

This Special Report will help address mobile phone separation anxiety and provide guidance on supporting your child's wellbeing during this transition period. We hope you take time to reflect on the information offered in this Special Report, and as always, we welcome your feedback.

On Friday 26 April, a speaker from Beyond Blue will be addressing interested Year 11 and 12 students in the Rivergum at 1.00pm. He will present his journey of hope, recovery, and resilience with depression.

Upcoming Middle School Student Leadership Programs and Initiatives

Parade College Year 10 and 11 leaders will be participating in the Northern Education Alliance Student Leadership Program during Term 2 and 3. The program will provide opportunities for students to build their leadership capacity, work collaboratively in teams, and expand their influence.

This program will take place over three full days throughout the school year in 2024. The following schools are participating in the program; Mernda Central College, Plenty Valley Christian College, Hazel Glen College, Marymede Catholic College, and Ivanhoe Grammar.

The Year 9 Student Leaders will be taking part in the Middle School Leaders Network Day at Assumption College on 28 May. Year 9 Morrisby Career Analysis

The Morrisby Careers Analysis will be conducted in ExCEL classes on Wednesday 1 May. This assessment provides valuable information that will inform subject selection, future careers, and pathway planning for students. The Morrisby Careers Analysis will help your child find their career direction using scientific profiling of abilities, personality, interests, and motivation to help them discover their unique characteristics.

With this awareness, they can ensure they can make the right subject choices in Years 10 to 12. They provide suggestions for future higher education courses and apprenticeships they would be best suited to. After completion, the report will be available on SIMON and PAM in 'Assessment Tasks' at the start of Term 3.

Preparing for Semester 1 Examinations

Year 8 to 11 preparation and exams will commence in a few weeks. Students should be encouraged to allocate time not only for homework but to revise for the semester examinations as well. In the coming weeks, students will also receive detailed instructions and tips on how to best prepare for their exams.

Please note that Wednesday 29 May is a normal ExCEL day for Year 9 students at the usual ExCEL locations, and attendance is required.

Normal classes run for Year 8 and 9 students when they are not in exams. All students are required to wear their correct full school uniform for all exams. Sport uniforms may only be worn on the designated ACC Sport days.

Where a Year 8 or 9 student is unable to attend an examination, it may not be possible to have the exam rescheduled. If a student misses an exam due to illness, then they will receive the grade 'X - Special Circumstance' for that task.

Students absent for an exam due to an approved school event, (for example ACC Sport) will be notified of an alternative time to sit the examination that was missed.

Year 10 and 11 Examinations

Year 10 and 11 students will have exams in all subjects.

The exams dates are Wednesday 5 June to Monday 17 June.

Please note that Monday 10 June is the day of the King's Birthday Public Holiday.

All students are required to wear their correct full school uniform for all exams. Sport uniforms may not be worn except by those involved in ACC Sport on the day of the exam.

Year 10 and 11 students are required to attend school for only the times of their exams plus 30 minutes prior. There will be no Tutor Group on these days for Year 10 and 11 students. Study halls will be available in the NLC for any student remaining at school during normal school hours. If a student does not attend a Year 10 or 11 examination, if possible, it will be rescheduled only for approved school events (for example ACC Sport) or upon presentation of a medical certificate.

From the Dean of Learning - Years 10 to 12

Nano Nagle Tutoring Program

Solid numbers have been attending the Nano Nagle Tutoring program which is taking place on Tuesdays and Thursdays in the VCE Study Centre.

In Term 2, the program will run every Tuesday and Thursday except Thursday 25 April and Tuesday 18 June. This program is available to all Year 11 and 12 VCE students and involves Old Paradian students from the class of 2023, who achieved extremely high ATAR scores, supervising and tutoring students.

It commences at 3.30pm and finishes at 4.25pm. VCE students are welcome to attend and receive help or study in the area. This is a great opportunity for all VCE students to get extra assistance with the demands of the final years of their schooling.

General Achievement Test (GAT)

All Year 12 students, and all accelerating Year 11 students will sit the GAT on Tuesday 18 June. The test will be conducted in the Greening Auditorium at the Bundoora Campus.

The following information comes from the Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority:

- The General Achievement Test (GAT) is a pen-and-paper test of general knowledge and skills taken by students in the course of completing their senior secondary studies.
- The GAT has two sections: Section A and Section B.
- Section A is a literacy and numeracy assessment comprised of a two-part writing task, 50 numeracy multiplechoice questions, and 50 reading multiple-choice questions.
- Section B is comprised of an extended writing task, 25 mathematics, science, and technology multiple-choice questions, and 25 arts and humanities multiple-choice questions.
- Students enrolled in one or more VCE or scored VCE VET Unit 3-4 sequence complete both sections.
- Students enrolled in one or more VCE Vocational Major

(VM) Unit 3-4 sequences, but who are not enrolled in any VCE or scored VCE VET Unit 3-4 sequences, complete Section A only.

The GAT plays an important role in the quality assurance of VCE assessments and also provides students with an opportunity to demonstrate they meet the Victorian Literacy and Numeracy Standards expected at a senior secondary level

The GAT is used as part of a final check on external assessment scores. If there is a significant statistical difference between the final score for an external assessment and the score predicted by the GAT and school indicative grades, the external assessment will be assessed again by the chief assessor. Scores may go up or stay the same, but they will not go down as a result of this final check. The GAT may also be used in the calculation of a Derived Examination Score.

No special study is needed. Past study of subjects like English, Mathematics, Science, and History prepares students for the GAT by building their general knowledge and skills in writing, numeracy, and reasoning.

A GAT Statement of Results is mailed to each student. The GAT Statement of Results indicates if the student has met the standard, not met the standard, or met the standard and demonstrated a level of excellence.

From the Leader of Literacy

Managing the Literacy Demands of the Curriculum

Literacy underpins learning in every subject area. Students are expected to read, write, speak, listen, and view in subject specific ways across the six - period day, placing significant cognitive demands on learners.

On a recent professional learning day, teaching staff compiled a list of the different forms of reading and writing students are expected to do in their subject areas.

One way we can help students manage the literacy demands of the curriculum is to be explicit about the reading and writing expectations of each subject. When you next notice your son reading as part of their homework, ask the following questions:

- What is the purpose of the reading you are doing now?
- How is the reading for this subject different from the reading for other subjects?
- What strategies do you have when you are having difficulty with a particular text?

These questions should lead to a rich discussion about the challenges of reading at a secondary school level. Students who struggle to answer the questions above should speak to their teachers for more guidance.




