Anzac Day

Last week we commemorated ANZAC Day. We remember that Old Paradians fought and died in each major campaign and many Old Paradians are serving in Australia's armed forces today. We remember in a particular way those that served in the WW1, WW2 and the Vietnam War on the Honour Boards in the Hickey Foyer.

The Chief Architect of the first ANZAC Day Solemn Service was an Anglican priest, Canon David John Garland, who pictured an *"All Souls' Day for Australia"* in 1916, to commemorate the losses suffered at Gallipoli. His wish was for the service to be acceptable to all faiths and denominations or it would not be observed.

I think observing ANZAC Day provides an opportunity for all of us to reflect on life and its meaning and its tragedies.

ANZAC Day, whilst in many ways a secular ceremony, has spiritual components that resonate for us as a Catholic school in the Edmund Rice tradition - be it in the sacrifice, in the lowering of the flag, the bugle call, the minute's silence something's calling us and, as people of faith, we would believe that God calls to us in these sacred moments.

Wednesday 31 May is a normal ExCEL day for Year 9 students, at the usual ExCEL locations, and full attendance is expected.

Normal classes run for Year 8 and 9 students when they are not in exams.

All students are required to wear their correct full school uniform in all exams. Sport uniforms may only be worn on the designated ACC Sport days.

Where a Year 8 or 9 student is unable to attend an examination, it may not be possible to have the exam rescheduled. If a student misses an exam due to illness, then they will receive the grade 'X-Special Circumstance' for that task.

Students absent for an exam due to an approved school event (eg; ACC Sport) will be notified of an alternative time to sit the examination that was missed.

Please note that Monday 12 June is the day of the King's Birthday public holiday.

All students are required to wear their correct full school uniform in all exams. Sport uniforms may not be worn except by those involved in ACC Sport on the day of the exam.

Year 10 and 11 students are required to attend school for the times of their exams plus 30 minutes prior. There will be no Tutor Group on these days. Study halls will be available for study to any students remaining at school during normal school hours.

If a student does not attend a Year 10 or 11 examinations, if possible, it will be rescheduled only for approved school events (eg; ACC Sport) or upon presentation of a medical certificate.

Excursion to La Trobe University, Centre for Agri Bioscience

On 27 April a group of students attended La Trobe University for an excursion to find out how the quality of milk produced from dairy cows can be improved through selective breeding and analysis of genotypes. Discovering genomic breeding, the enabling of prediction of multiple complex traits in a breeding population by using large amounts of genotype data.

The first task was DNA extraction, we were placed into small groups and given wheat germ. After combining it with detergent, meat tenderiser, and bicarbonate soda it created a small layer where we could see the small threads of the molecular build-up for wheat germ.

For the next group, we used a program called Blast to identify what a bacterium was and whether or not it was pathogenic and where it could be regrown. Another task was DNA sequencing, using a syringe we would suck up the DNA and place it into a small device that could tell us the DNA sequence of the plant or animal.

Overall, we had so much fun learning about new things and getting to know my friends better. We would like to thank Mr Daniel Willcocks and Mr David Paolino for conducting the excursion.

It is a series of online tests assessing a student's logic, verbal, non-verbal, and numerical reasoning, spatial awareness, and mechanical aptitude. The *Morrisby Profile* is a powerful career guidance tool, which identifies students' strengths and sources of motivation.

The Morrisby Test will take place over two days during the morning block of the Excel program that your son is undertaking.
